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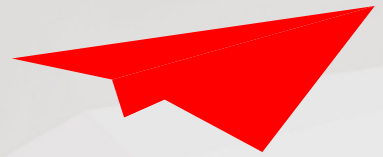

Deriving from Holistic Education and Constructivism Learning Theory, following the concept of traditional Chinese culture and education, instead of totally changing learner's abilities, competency-based education is aimed at giving chances for learners to connect with the real society and unknown fields, providing possibilities for them to make investigations on those situations.

In order to help children to become dream chasers by pursuing truth and love and learn the relationship with human and unknown world, Adream Foundation focuses on three main procedures to build core competences:
Truth-seeking: Making choices and Thinking;
Pursuing Love: Cognition and Connection;
Chasing Dream: Exploration and Practice.

The core project "Adream Center" Competency-based Education service system:

A Competency-based Education service system for children integrates with hardware, software and training service, which contains:

To Build the Shape of Future's Classroom: To rebuild a classroom named "Adream Center" as Competency-based Education's learning space.

To Provide Competency-based Education Courses: As the core of "multielement, tolerant, innovative", to build "Adream Curriculum" for children in basic education stage, and incorporate it into the implementation of school's curriculum system.

To Set up Teacher's Training System: To set up Teacher's "Five-Star Growing System" with multielement, multiple scenes and interactive creation, to offer training to frontline teachers and principals continuously, to encourage and accompany educators to become lifelong learner, to become children's "Dream Leader".

To build Internet support platform: To build a platform named "Adream Box" to provide interactive place for educators and other supportive resources by using internet technology

To Go into Community: As an extension of Competency-based Education service for Parent-child, mixed age and after school activities, to release the "Adream Center" into communities.

Adream's Project Result

Since the establishment in 2008, we have totally raised RMB 738,000,000. Our competency-based education system has covered over 3.65 million teachers and students from 3319 schools in 31 provinces, offering training to 90,108 teachers in total. In 2018, we built 346 new Adream Centers. The number of teachers involved in Adream Curriculum has risen to 24,908 in total. According to statistics, the number of courses came to 580,000 during spring and fall semesters.

Adream is the first charitable foundation in China that published its annual report according to the transparency standards set for listed companies. From 2011 to 2014, Adream has continuously been hailed as “China’s Most Transparent Charitable Foundation” by Fobes(China). In both 2016 and 2017, Adream was hailed as “China’s Most Transparent Charitable Foundation” by Jiemian News.

The founders and management team comprise senior managers and professionals who have brought mature and efficient commercial management tools into the flow of charity system of competency-based education of Adream Center. In 2017, Adream achieved ISO9001:2015 certification and became the first non-governmental organization that passed SGS global NGO criteria in China.

The Continuous Operational Support

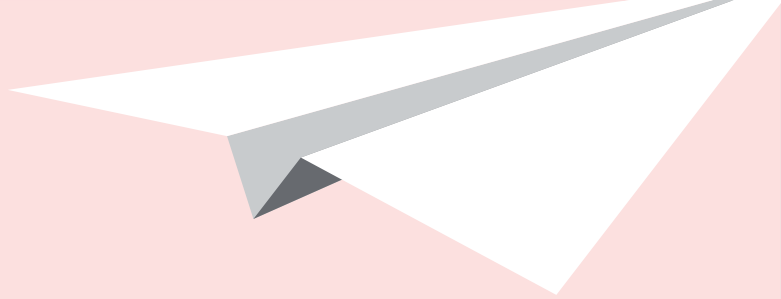

Adream has set a series of quantified evaluation criteria for internal management and the establishment, operation, curriculum training, curriculum implementation, and so on. The evaluation system also allows our donors to know more about the performances, strategies, achievements and mistakes during the process of working and raise targeted suggestions to improve our work.

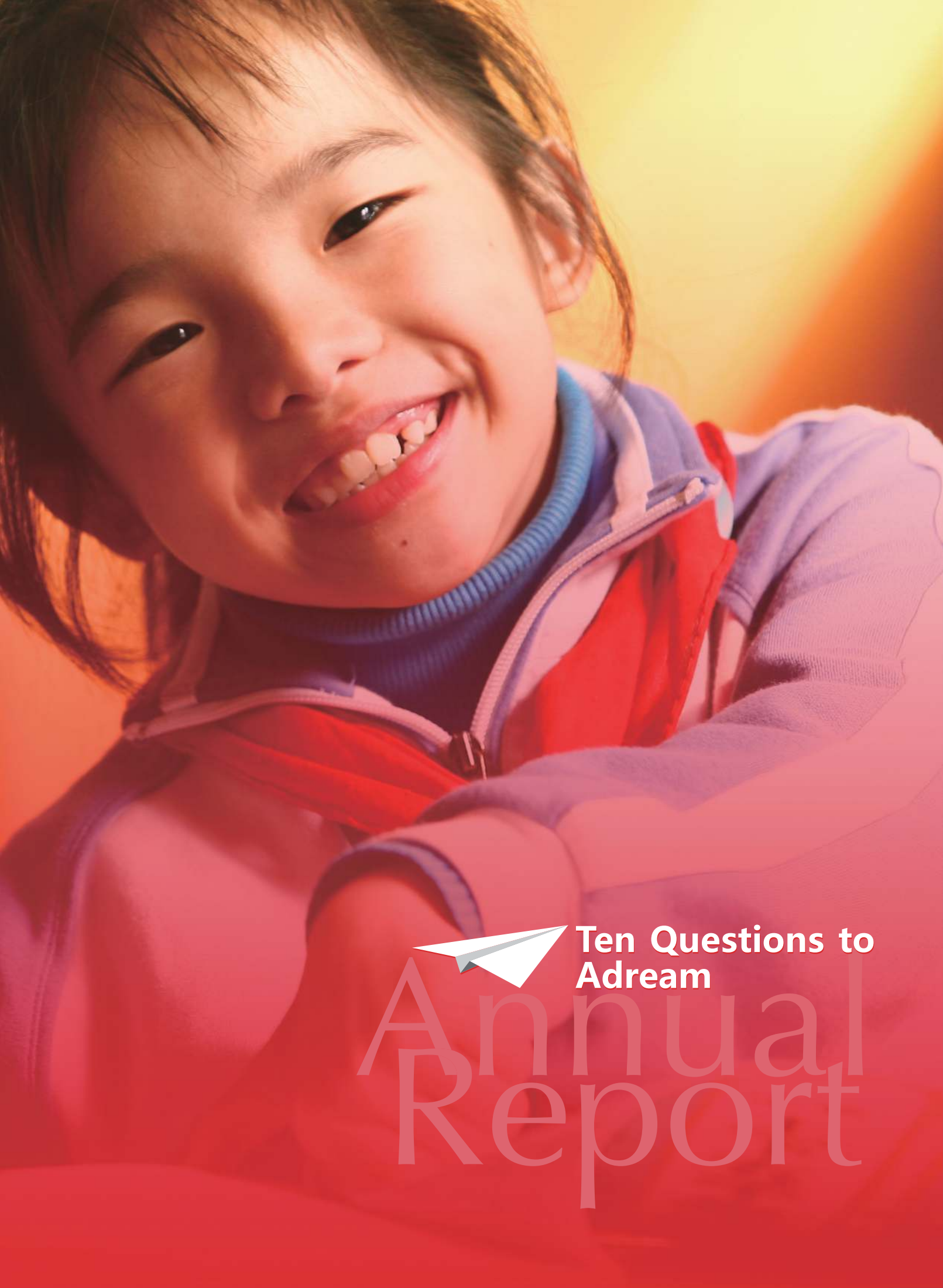

Ten Questions to Adream

1. Why we choose education?

Many people criticize that Chinese education is “teaching something without cultivating”. We think “the acquisition of common knowledge point + highly competitive learning atmosphere + the absence of individual curiosity and healthy personality” is conducted by utilitarian education towards test selection mechanism.

The unbalance of the society and the back of these problems are closely related to education. The development of society is promoted by the upgrade of people’s cognitions. The upgrade of people’s cognitions could be accomplished by learning, and education is the main type for people to acquire knowledge. Therefore, the promotion of the development of society could be accomplished by improving education. The mission of Adream is to develop competency-based education, to promote the equality of education, and to drive social process through education.

The competency-based education that Adream advocates derives from Holistic Education and Constructivism Learning Theory, following the concept of traditional Chinese culture and education.

Our aim is to arise children’s cognition of “Life Learning”, to give learners chances to connect with themselves, the people, the real society and unknown fields, providing them possibilities to make investigation on those situations, and to help them become “Dream Chaser who pursues truth and love”.

2. What pain points of education we aim to solve?

Many people criticize that Chinese education is “teaching something without cultivating”. We think “the acquisition of common knowledge point + highly competitive learning atmosphere + the absence of individual curiosity and healthy personality” is conducted by utilitarian education towards test selection mechanism.

3. What do we do?

11 years ago, Adream started to try to face the pain points of examination-oriented education. We built “Adream Center”, which is the prototype of competency-based charitable products integrated with hardware and software and support to upgrade.

The original thought was quite pure, which is to establish a school library for students just like “Chengpin”. This library could be the most beautiful classroom in this school, which could be the place for children to make dreams, could be the place that widen student’s horizon which still in the compulsory education period. We hope we can help those children which limited by the big mountain. By our books and computers, we could help them look to the outside and see this fantastic world, renewed yearning for school living and learning.

We designed, constructed and operated the Adream Center within our imagine to the future classrooms:

First, the content we would learn in the Adream should be interdisciplinary and integrated.

Second, the method to learn knowledge should mainly be theme learning and project learning.

Thirdly, the environment for learning should be exploratory. Children are encouraged to help each other and work in team.

Fourthly, the character of teacher should be auxiliary and guided.

4. What is “Adream Curriculum” we say?

The competency-based Education we say is the education that help children to look into the future. The carrier of it is a classroom in school. The content of it is Adream Curriculum which has 36 modules and supports for students from grade 1 to grade 9. The way for teaching is not teacher teaching and students to repeat. It includes learning with theme, problem investigation, team working and presentation for sharing. The content to learn includes:

Who we are—Encourage children to learn themselves

Where we to go—Inspire children’s imagination

How we go—The method and techniques to achieve dreams

We encourage teachers to establish an Adream course per week for children via Adream Center. Hope this could open children’s heart and horizon, to become a “dream chaser who pursues love and truth”. Every curriculum starts with children’s curiosity. No matter where they are and no matter good or bad on their grades, they still have chances to achieve their dreams.

Three concepts of Adream Curriculum: Question is more important than Answers, Method is more important than Knowledge, Trust is more important than Help. As Adream Centers have existed all over the country, children have attended more than 3 million Adream Curriculums. In these classes, children can write wired stories basis on their hometown specialty, perform their own operas. They are encouraged to explain their concepts by doing speeches and debates, or to gain people’s agreements towards one action plan. Sometimes, they would even come out of classroom. Teachers would bring children to walk into the nature and use stethoscope to listen tree’s heartbeat. They would also learn financial knowledge in the Adream Center, realizing the differentiated market competition strategy and win-win negotiation method...



We have 3-minute video for financing course, for we can see how this Adream Curriculum goes.

5. How to build these 3338 Adream Centers?

Charitable organization always admire programs which are tiny but fantastic. When Adream stepped into the education charitable field, we investigated the business model of chain stores, and designed the standard Adream Center construction model which is easily to be large-scale replication. This is the first iteration of our product. This iteration helps us to have ability to upgrade the configuration of Adream Center every one or two years. Nowadays, Adream Center has iterated to 6.0 edition. Because of the standard construction process, every four staffs can establish more than 400 Adream Centers within one year.

6. How to operate our “Adream Chain Stores”

First of all, the core product in Adream Center is Adream Curriculum.

We have designed more than 30 kinds of Competency-based Education curriculums that suit for children from grade 1 to grade 9. These curriculums have listed into the normal school curriculums and become the school-based curriculums.

Secondly, we would train the manager of the chain store—the president of this school. Meanwhile, we would also train the staff—the teacher. To achieve this point, we established multilevel teacher training and learning system. From 1-star Teacher Training Camp, Principal’s Leadership F Plan to Director’s Workshop, Adream helps education workers to find chance to learn inside and outside the class, to find the meaning of education and to be children’s Adream Guide under the pressure of examination.

Finally, we build an online social community for teachers—Adream Box, which supports more than 60,000 verified teachers to communicate with each other online.

In a conclusion, we regard love as the foundation, the curriculum as the carrier, the research as the support, the learning community as the engine, “internet + education” as the mechanism, to give interactive learning support to 80,000+ national frontline teachers

with diversification, multiple scenarios and multi-social functions, and we also advocate educators to be life-long learning. By pushing accompanying empowerment methods like “National Principals Changer Training” and “Adream Vision Director Training Workshop”, we can make the change of the educational environment with the core of Competency-based Education.

7. What is our education charitable concept?

Similar to education, charity is not related to certain people. Everyone needs to be concerned. We have experienced following periods over more than ten years’ investigation into education charitable field:

Charity 1.0—Provide material and monetary donation, help poor children to afford the school fees.

Charity 2.0— Provide training for teachers, help children to learn with high qualified teaching.

Charity 3.0-- Cross-border empowerment, help children to learn well.

We now have shaped the with capital cooperation model with 204 counties in all over the country. We have received donations from enterprises, individuals and governments which sum up to 737,000,000 RMB, and provide sustainable competency-based education services to 3,600,000 children in this country.

8. How to use business concepts to do public service?

When we first stepped into the charitable field in 2007, we claimed clearly that we would bring “the business concepts and operation model to the charitable field”. Business experience helped to solve the resource allocation problem while limited resource was faced with unlimited needs. But how to solve the contradiction of limited donations with unlimited needs from people who need help? Adream first started to do strategy on the resource allocation. The pain point Adream found was the gap between the content children learned and the future required. To solve this pain point problem of competency-based education, we did resource allocation, equipped Adream Center with hardware and packed services of 5-year curriculum and teacher training service system.

To build Adream Center needs to control quality. We copy the chain model of McDonald’s and Starbucks. We continuously decompose every step of construction and produce standard construction solution, asking schools to supervise the procedure. This standard constructive progress achieves the standardization of each steps, including remote designing, purchasing, logistics and construction installation.

To build the chain store need an operation management system. Every Adream Center is the “Knowledge Chain Store” of Adream. The most significant manager for it is the teacher. Therefore, we build multilevel training system for education workers. We also build offline communities for our teachers, to build the Adream Center operation system all together, integrating to each separate school and playing the cluster effect of chain stores.

We developed a system relates to project risk management and project evaluation. The indexes relate to many processes such as the risk management of chosen point, the choice and evaluation of suppliers, the evaluation of curriculum, the operation and supervise of project, the effect evaluation etc. For example, for the evaluation and selection of the school, this system will imitate credit card issuance review mechanism. By written assessment, telephone interview and field investigation to do cross reviews. Finally, the committee will choose whether this school will pass the selection. Adream will help self-helper. We hope schools will not just simply receive donations, but to make efforts to change the problem of backward education in the local area.

In 2017, Adream achieved ISO9001 (2015 edition) certification and became the first non-governmental organization to pass this certification in China. Adream also passed SGS global NGO criteria and became the top 5% NGO which have top management standard in the worldwide.

9. What are the differences about traditional charity with modern public service?

Charity is personal activity; public service is public activity;

The core of charity is to give; the core of public service is to join;

The aim of charity is to aid; the aim of public service is to empowerment;

Charity is a kind of redistribution of wealth basis on individual’s moral; public service is a kind of society revolution basis on public’s benefit;

Charity is conducted by individual; public service must be a mechanized organizational behavior.

Therefore, public service has apparent publicity:

1) To Achieve public aim: not for the aim of a company or an individual/family

2) Public ownership: the real conductor is not a company or an individual/family

3) Public mobilization ability: speak to public, be fundraised to public and promote public to join in

4) Value orientation for accepting public accountability: be exposed to public and supervised by public

5) Promote public discuss procedure: aim to solve crucial social problems

10. How can we achieve transparency?

In 2009, Adream Foundation wrote an annual report for the first time. Just like most charitable organization did, we were used to reporting our results in “doing the right things, telling the sorrowful stories”. This kind of description about donation amount of public and activities, is the simplest public transparency 1.0.

The annual report of 2010 includes not only the disclosure of data and report, but also the reflection of our work. We disclosed the information of foundation in a structured way. Whether we did the wrong things or some issues happened, every content of report will be disclosed perennially. Besides, regulator also needs us to disclose our balance sheet. Statement of Operating Activities and Cash Flow Statement can demonstrate the assets of foundation and all activities’ situation of operation. However, Adream Foundation is one of the fewest foundations which are willing to disclose financial notes: affiliated transactions, income from investments, details of income from large donations, details of projects activities expenses, management expenses, salaries of council and supervisor, employee wages and the component capital structure are all very clear.

If transparency 1.0 is still telling the story, transparency 2.0 is to tell a story by means of systematization and structuration. However, the transparency 3.0 is “reflection in public and transparent process”.

The Adream annual report has detailed analysis. We would analyze how we get our fundraising every year. We would also discuss the reason for the growth of fundraising—which could be sustainable and which are newly added. We could find our growth while we do analysis. Meanwhile, let our donors and colleagues see why Adream have grown so rapidly. Besides the analysis of fundraising, we also rethink about the operation of organization and invite independent third-party professional organization to do the evaluation of program effect. Only if we directly face the problems could we get sustainable development.

Opening to public is the work valuation of Adream. Transparency is the way to present this valuation. It not only reflects on our website and annual report, but also involves into every working details from our Adream buddies. We couldn’t get the transparent result without the transparent process. A qualified transparency not only requires courage, but even to be the necessary choice for every public service organizations which need public offering to build their own living structure.

Adream Foundation is committed to promote the change of Chinese education, to develop competency-based education and to promote the balance of education. We welcome everyone to be with Adream, to empower the Chinese education and build sustainable public service.

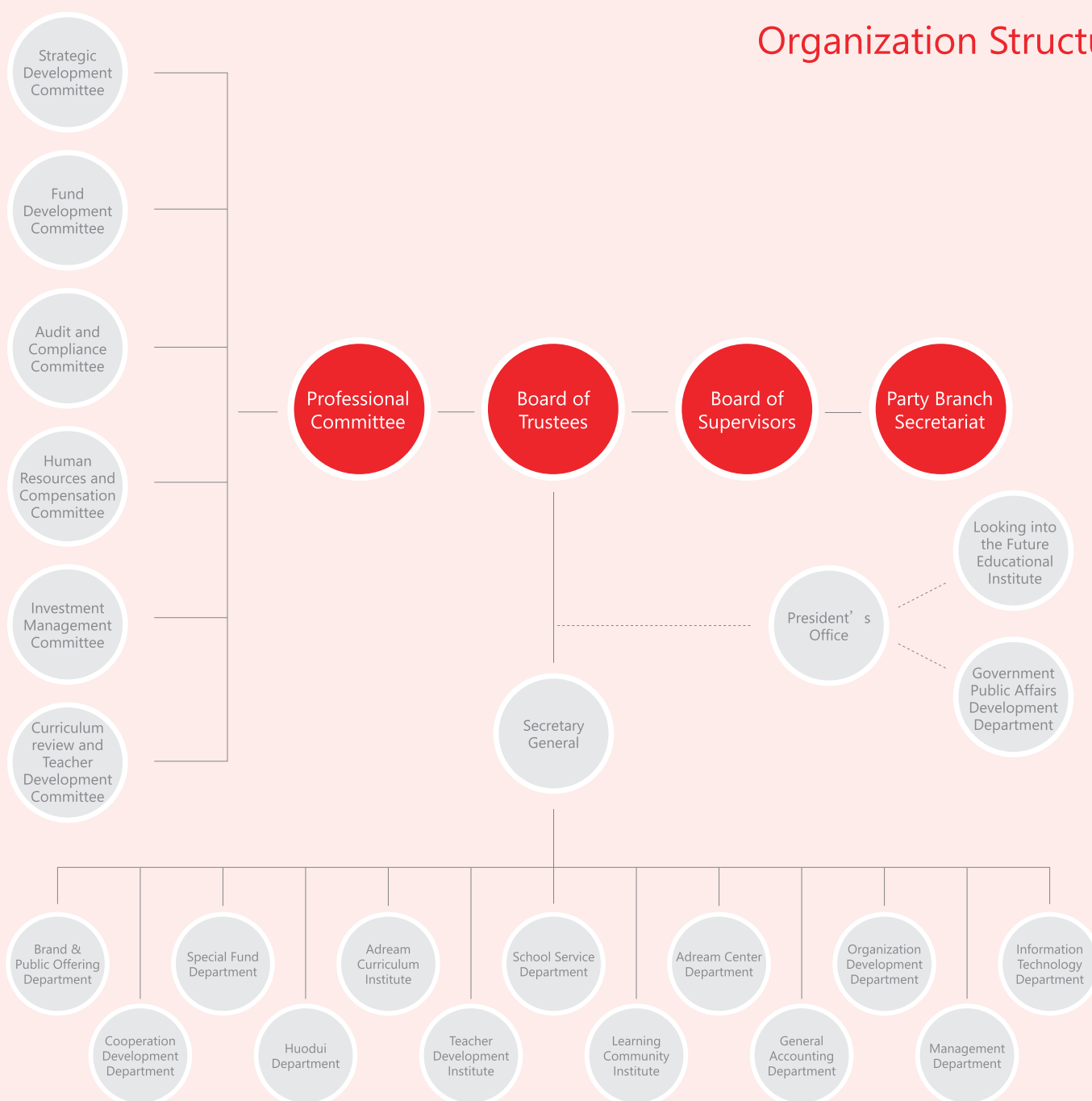

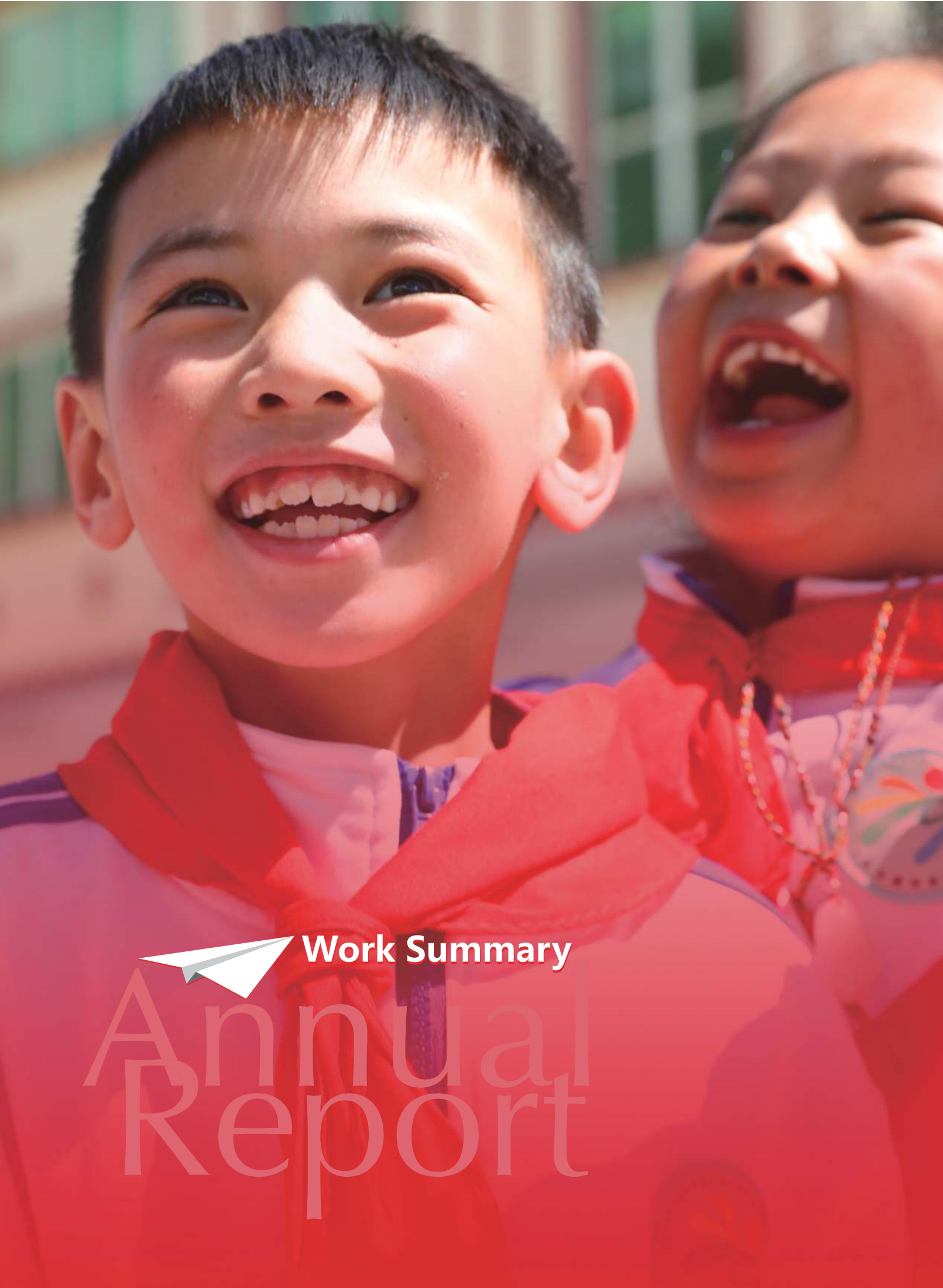

Organization Structure

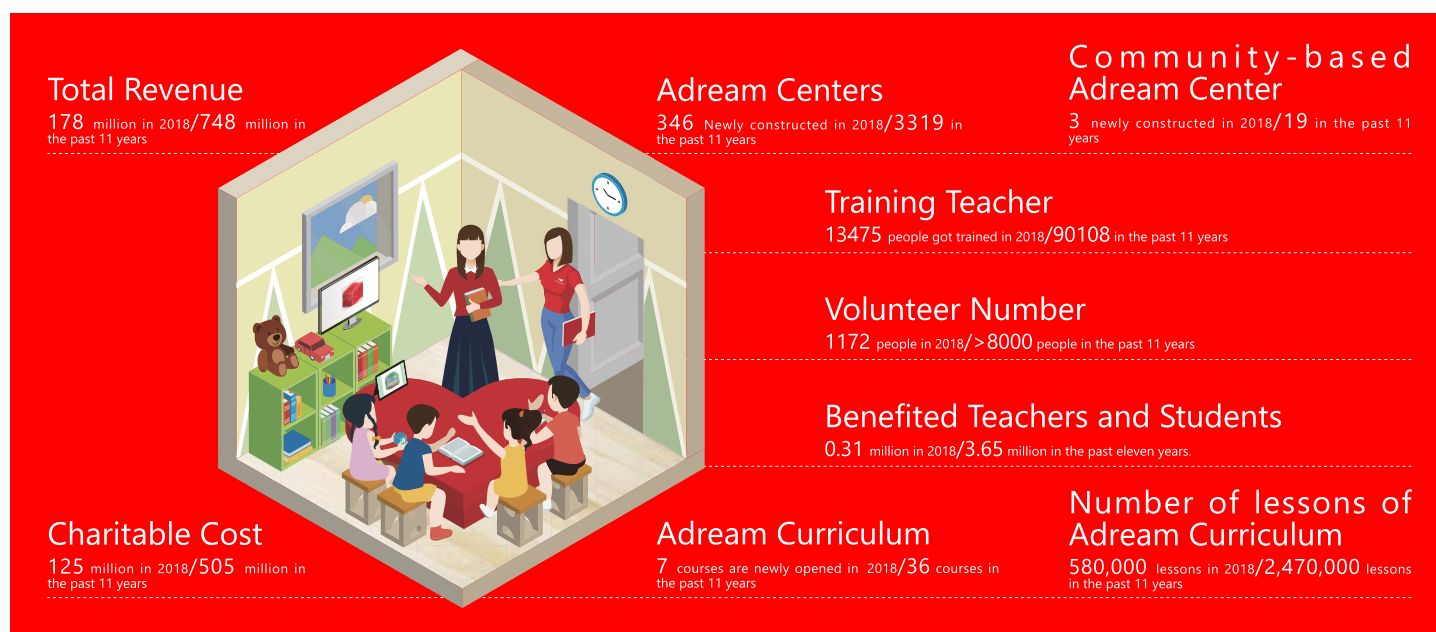

2018 Work Summary



It has been ten years since Adream was established in 2008, and the year 2018 plays a significant role in Adream's ten-year strategy. Like the transformation of social economy in China, there's a similar power of innovation in Adream. In 2018, focusing on the theme called "Deep Diving· Competency Education", we pay attention to the research and development of Adream Curriculum, training for teachers and service provided by Adream Center. Also, we developed multi-lateral cooperative relationship with our friends and initially built a localized service-running system. We performed as a model and mutually helped with the aided, aimed at stimulating their willingness and actions to make a change. Meanwhile, we actively promoted the second developing curve of educational innovation.

1. As for money-raising, benefitted from the steady construction consisting of enterprise's and personal large donation, public donation, foundation's allocated funds and governmental allocated funds, Adream basically achieved the goal of donating 170 million yuan set at the beginning of 2018. The money collected on "Sharing Love" charity dinner broke the record, and special funds developed steadily. We specially made a breakthrough in online donation and completed the overall arrangement of each donating platform. Relying on "99 Public Welfare Day" from Tencent, "95 Public Welfare Week" from Ali, Ant Manor, Wechat Pay and Walking Donation, we collected more than 48.49 million yuan from over 10.4 million donors, which means that Adream's public influence is widely recognized.

2. As for competency-based education, we stuck to efficient and professional working value, further perfected the system of supply chain, and explored the non-standard customization of Adream center, which not only met the demands from donors and the aided, but also set the foundation for the extensive design of competency-based educational space in the future. We finished the report of Adream's core competency. Based on the student's core competency evaluation, the design of initial evaluation scale was finished, and the cycle from theoretical structure-curriculum development-evaluation was formed. Meanwhile, it has gradually transferred from development mode to service mode focusing on curriculum, which set the direction of curriculum productization. In 2018, we established the brand-new teacher development system—five-star teacher development map. Also, we established the online teacher developing institute, providing Adream teacher's all-round development with a more complete structure, empowering all educators in full scale.

3. As for the running of deep cultivation service, we know that the ultimate beneficiaries of competency-based education are children, and

the key roles play in disseminating knowledge are school and teacher. In 2018, the core of running Adream Center was to promote the first-tier deep cultivation running by local power, to establish supervision system, and to activate local supervision. The Salon Group started New Village Scholar system to promote the performance of policy published by local bureau of education and the service run by school. During this process, the rare of opened class reached 70%.

4. As for internal management, we supported the development of organization by Internet technology. The process of practice was transparent, making the public welfare program "Item establishment-examination and approval-financial management-knot" able to be seen online on time, so that our clients can completely know and supervise the process of development of program. Based on the Curriculum Card (1.0 Edition) finished on Wechat terminal, the information about Adream courses was updated in the way of Couse-Wikipedia, making Adream teachers download the course files, communicate and study online in convenience. All in all, from the finish of donation guided by data to putting the service into practice, as well as the closed-cycle management from school life period to teacher life period, they are all the directions that we will stick to in the next three years.

5. As for the promotion of industry, we established a new industry empower mode: Huodui Charity (breeding service)-United donation(empowering)-Special Fund(united action), which share our friends with managing and running experience that we accumulated. In 2018, we not only maintained high-level social responsibility and reliability but also cooperated with Tingshua Mingde Public Charity institute to establish charity evaluation platform and promote the setting of standards of charity evaluation as Chairman-in-Office of Foundation. We initially drafted and published Shanghai Social Organization Self-discipline Treaty, and promoted social organizations in Shanghai to perfect their rules of self-discipline, aimed at shouldering the responsibilities of promoting the foundational construction of public welfare and perfecting the ecological system.

Dream is what happened, what is happening and what is going to happen in reality. During strategic transition period, we have made changes during practice and go on with hope and belief. In 2018, we gradually started to construct the organization and set talent strategy that adapt to the future development. We changed the name of Human Resources Department to Organizational Development Department and reconstructed secretariat team for young generation, aimed at restoring talents to meet new opportunities and challenges in the future.

Investment products mainly include: securities investment, low risk products with fixed annual rate covered by Zhongan Insurance. To calculate the disposed part of earnings, Investment returns are calculated by the cost method.

Other revenues mainly include bank interests, commission charges and foreign exchange profit and loss. According to the changes in exchange rates at the end of the last year, the annual profit by foreign exchange was 66,000 RMB.

Until the end of 2018, Adream had set up 22 special funds in total.

As the number of community Adream Center increased, this report would list it separately since 2018.

Other limited expenses mainly include RMB 10.84 million for 99 Charity Day program, RMB 1.15 million for MIS system, RMB 7.02 million for the Huodui program, RMB 3.15 million for Adream Caravan, RMB 2.53 million for Learning Community Institute and RMB 22.77 million for material donations.

Operating capital ratio is calculated as: end-of-year net asset balance divided by annual total expenditures. This indicates the number of years the foundation can sustain operations without external donations. According to international conventions, a ratio of 1 or higher indicates a stable and healthy financial state.

Per capita efficiency of full-time employees is calculated as: the annual total expenditures divided by the number of full-time employees at year-end, which include 66 full-time employees of the foundation and 31 full-time employees of charitable development center.

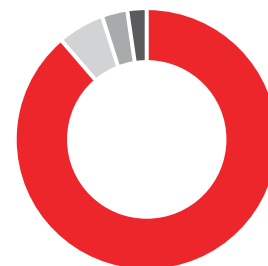

2018 Fundraising Report

Fundraising Summary

In 2018, Adream received donation and service income totally over RMB 168 million, increased by 19% of compared the same time last year, almost reaching the RMB 170 million goal which was set up at the beginning of this year.

During this year, we still promoted cooperation with private funds, public offering funds and donations from government. Donations from private funds was still a very significant way for Adream. Besides, donations from public offering funds have been gradually in growth in the recent years. Although our projects were diversified, the ten-year "Adream Center" Project still occupied an absolute advantage. The donation amount by top10 donors occupied 32% of total amount, including in-kind donation value RMB 21,184,203. According to the result of 2018 Donor's Satisfaction Survey, the score raised from 86.25 in 2017 to 86.5. We also widened the investigating range of the survey this time. In the past, only large donors in private funds would be included. In 2018, we also investigated government's satisfaction into the calculation.

The Analysis of Fundraising and Reflection

1. Private donation was still the main force of donation. In 2018, the private fundraising accounted for 57% of total fundraising, and the repeat rate reached up to 60%. Face-to-face project introduction and communication helped donors to learn deeply about Adream's mission and methods as well as built strong trust between each other. Meanwhile, we continued to push "Donors into Adream". Adream used methods like parent-child charitable summer camp, making donors participate into charitable projects and increasing their practical experiences. Donors and recipients truly saw and empowered each other. 2018 "Beautiful without Frontiers, Deep Driving for Dream" Sharing Love Charitable Auction Dinner Party totally fundraised 68.52 million RMB, which was higher than ever before.

2. The public offering donation further achieved a breakthrough. In 2018, the total fundraising amount by public offering donation was over 48.49 million, increasing by 23% over last year. The yearly accumulated donation reached 10.40 million times. In recent years, Adream's public offering donation has grown exponentially, benefitting from public's incremental recognition towards charities, accumulated public praises to our foundation over these years, and continuously innovative investigation through internet. In 2018, we completed the layout of the major fundraising platforms, and actively participated into fundraising activities of various traffic platforms such as "Tencent Charity", "Ant Finance Charity", "Taobao Charity" and "Jingdong Charity". With the support of platforms, more and more individuals in public learned from us and supported us by small amount donations, monthly donations and behavioral donations. Among them, donations from "Ant Finance Charity" were much higher than the behavior on other platforms. The yearly accumulated fundraising reached 12.61 million RMB, which was 5.2 times that of 2017. The total accumulated fundraising reached 7.72 million times, which will become the core growth point for public offering donation in 2019.

3. In-kind donations increased dramatically. In 2018, Adream received in-kind donations value as 22.84 million RMB, including teaching materials, sports equipment and daily necessities, in case to improve the former school teaching equipment and to support poverty alleviation. In-kind donations accounted for 13% of total fundraising, increasing by 10% compared with last year. But frankly Speaking, the ability to receive and use surges in in-kind donations tested the ability to coordinate social resources. For Adream, how to find the demands based on our mission, how to guide donors to improve the efficiency of in-kind donation would be our direction to keep it up.

4. The amount of government funds allocated reduced due to

related policy. In 2018, Adream received over 23 million RMB donations from government, which accounted for 14% of total fundraising and slightly decreased compared with 2017. Local government fundraising was an important part of our deepening of regional education ecology. Its value was not only the support of funds, but more significantly, the willingness of regional reform and the support of related policies. In 2018, Adream Center project still gained agreement from local government and bureau of education and achieved over 32 million RMB funding intention. The real funding donation was lower than the expected, as government needed to concentrate on financial strength to achieve poverty alleviation. For regions that had a strong intention to introduce Adream Center project but were affected by the policy, we would also actively guide donors to support them.

5. The obstacle of the diversity of fundraising still existed. In 2018, the leading project of fundraising was still the Adream Center Project. As for the core part of Competency-based Education, the fundraising for teacher training was still relatively difficult. The yearly fundraising only accounted for 2% of total amount, which still couldn't solve the existing problems. Besides, our unlimited administrative fees only accounted for 2% of total fundraising, while raising unlimited administrative fees was still our bottleneck. We eagerly expect every Adream partner to support to empower teacher's development training project and provide unlimited funds for the organization for long-term development.

Adream Independent research and development programs

Adream Center Program

Adream Center Project is the core product for Adream's competency-based education system, which combines with the hardware "Adream Center" classroom, the software "Adream Curriculum" and five-year operation services. In 2018, Adream adhered to the strategy of deep diving into the operation of Adream Center, releasing the growth speed of amount of Adream Centers and spending more resources in fulfilling the online and offline integrated operation service system. In 2018, the amount of newly built school Adream Center decreased by 17% as much of last year, however, the cost of operation services increased by 10% compared with last year. The class start rate nearly reached 70% in schools under 5-year operation services term, and the number of joint capital allocation districts and counties were reached 204.

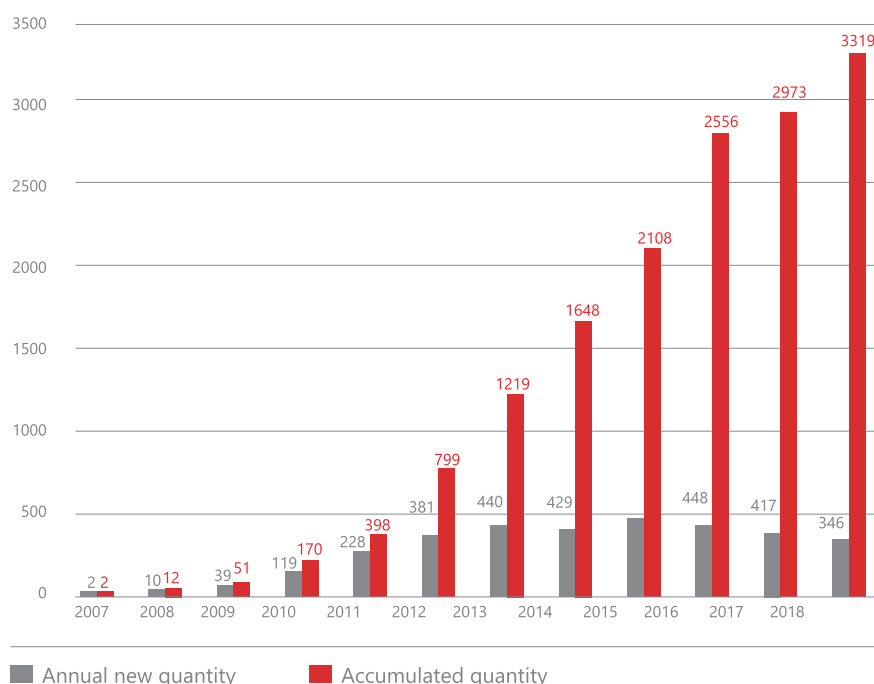
Adream Center Construction

Adream Center is the specialized classroom that carries Adream's concepts of competency-based education, as well as the significant method to transform traditional teaching concept. We believe the specialized space will improve human relationship. With elaborately design of color pattern, function area, and aid of multi-media equipment, the Adream Center is aimed at providing a place to children to learn in group, think independently and work cooperatively. They could learn with fun and cultivate an excellent character in Adream Centers.

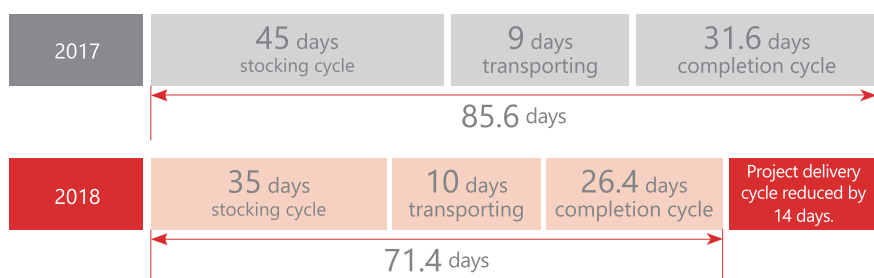
In 2018, we built 346 new Adream Center in total, including 317 units in 6.0 edition and 29 units in 5.0 edition. Meanwhile, to satisfy the multiple needs of donors and school clients, we firstly tried to do customized investigation, continuously publishing big screen Adream Center and iPad edition Adream Center. We further improved supply chain performance, optimized replenishment strategies, compressed the lead times and reduced inventory. In a conclusion, the purchasing cycle of 37 categories reduced to 71.4 days from 85.6 days in last year. The annual inventory turnover days were 35 days, making the charitable operation more efficient by reducing the cost.



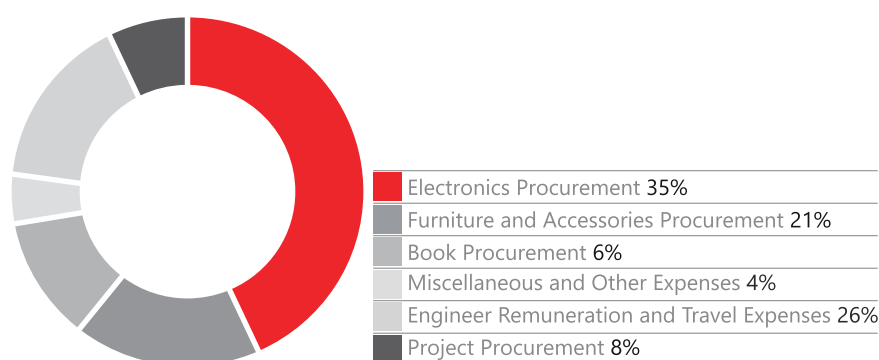
Growth of Adream Centers



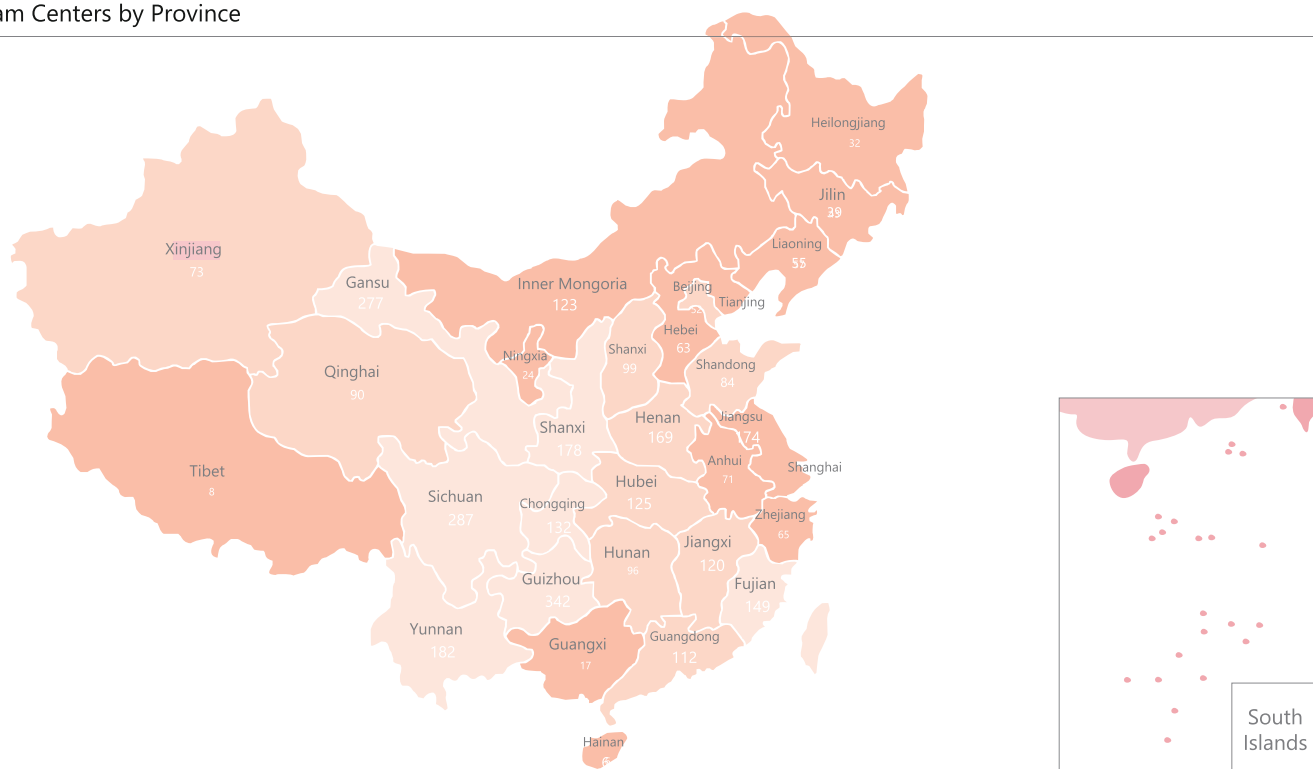
Overall supply chain delivery situation

Operation Services of Adream Center

In 2018, the core of Adream Center's operation was to use local teacher and volunteer's power to promote the deep diving of front-line operation. Adream initially built a localized operation service system, and encouraged Adream Teacher salon team and promoted New Hometown Sage strategy by hiring Adream Supervisors to develop regional education ecological activation.

In 2018, we recruited 15 local educational specialists to be our Adream Supervisors, to associate with each regional manager to do regular visits, lectures, and Adream Teacher Salons, making sure the operation status of school Adream Center was on time. After one year's try, we formed the regular standard and process of recruiting, training and evaluating work towards Adream Supervisors. The Adream Center's operation management efficiency was specifically improved, which was occupied by Adream Supervisors. The average class start rate was over 90%. The Adream Teacher Salon reached 269, which covered 1315 Adream Center School. Adream Teacher Salon actively organized Competency-based Education teaching and research activities, to upgrade teaching abilities of Adream Teachers and to promote the Adream Curriculum to be put into practice. In 2018, there were 1925 schools within 5-year operation service term distributed into 624 districts, counties, with a density of 5.32/county. We visited nearly 1000 schools in this year, and finished nearly 500 Adream Curriculum listening class.

We were always looking forward to promoting hometown's education by "New Hometown Sage". Taking hometown as a link and educational public welfare as a boost, to push

the Adream Center to land in. In 2018, with the promotion of New Hometown Sage, we got corporation with Feidong county in Anhui province, Xihe county in Gansu province, which proved the availability of New Hometown Sage strategy. However, the recruitment and cooperate mechanism of New Hometown Sage hasn't been completely established, it didn't form a greater impact in 2018.

Promoting school to start with curriculum activities has also been an important way for Adream to explore in recent years. In 2018, the fifth season of "Going the Distance Study Tour" that teachers and students were looking forward to was launched with the support of Zhejiang Dunhe charitable foundation. 137 schools, 193 teachers and 2865 students from 243 classes signed up for this activity. Finally, we chose

97 outstanding team, which composed of 535 students and 70 following teachers, as well as 48 volunteers as children's protectors. Not only can our children finish the travelling plan design independently but also go to 17 cities to practice their travelling plans during the summer vacation, including walking into the enterprise to do PBL theme learning and career experience. More children used their footsteps to measure their hometown, learnt about folk traditions and explored their hometown treasures. "Helping children to go outside the campus, to investigate the unknown world independently" was the original thought of this project, and we are also look forward to receiving more donor support in the future to help more children realize their dreams.



Curriculum Research and Development

2018 was the year in which the Adream Curriculum system was gradually iteratively upgraded. From Adream Curriculum's 1.0 Self-Selection System built to be a "multi-choice supermarket" to the 2.0 Core System built to be "boutique course package", then to the Research of 3.0 Special System and higher standard curriculum, a professional closed loop from theoretical framework, curriculum development to effect evaluation was basically formed. Finished the development of 2.0 Curriculum system and Community Adream Center 1.0 Curriculum system. The curriculum development would gradually shift from the research model to the mode of service around the curriculum, which would open the direction of curriculum productization.

2.0 Series Adream Curriculum pushed online live training, Q&A and micro class, and continuously carried out offline curriculum special training

for Love and Dream, Career Life, Technology Innovator, Dream Stage, International Understanding and Financial Awareness. By using different forms, the Adream Teacher's inner lift up for Adream Curriculum was promoted.

In 2018, based on Adream's educational philosophy, we finished and published "Adream Power Competency-based Education Research Report", and formed a theoretical structure in three dimensions: being willing to build a dream, being good at building a dream, daring to build a dream. Combined with student's competency-based education comments, student competency-based evaluation scale was initially shaped, which included 6 major items and 36 questions.

Meanwhile, we associated with East China Normal University Curriculum and Teaching Institute held the fourth "Adream Cup" National School-based Curriculum Design Competition and Seminar, to help teachers across the country improve their curriculum development abilities.

Teacher Development

In 2018, Adream provided more than 180 offline trainings, including teacher training, principle and director workshop, to educators, accumulated training 13475 people. In 2015, "Adream Guide" Teacher training system started to be formed. After three years' polishing, it was upgraded to accomplish five-star Teacher growth map and brochure. This was a milestone of great significance in 2018. The new edition teacher growth map focused on the growth of human, and turned the main role from curriculum to educators, from a single training program to be the whole accompany process. It combined learning with practice, making them more complete, and also laid the foundation for the full support of the growth of educators. The "Adream Coach" volunteers would bring 3-day training for teachers in the whole country every summer vacation. In the process of empowering multiple volunteers and front-line teachers, the concept of Adream Curriculum was conveyed and teachers were encouraged to change their will. In 2018, 497 volunteers, 52 teaching teams, provided training to 7652 teachers in 1255 schools. 30% of the trainees spontaneously opened Adream Curriculum in the fall semester. These stimulated Adream Teachers would be the biggest incentive for us as well as the best gift for children.

Online Operations

In 2012, to meet for the needs of operating all the school Adream Centers, Adream put forward the website “Adream Box” , which could not only be the online learning and social platform for Adream teachers but also collect online service data. The total signed users in Adream Box reached 80k in 2018.

“Adream Box” website mainly uses PC site. At the moment of the rapid development of the mobile internet, to cater for user’ s experience and satisfy the needs for curriculum products and online & offline integrated operation, we concentrated our IT power to investigate applications like curriculum card, Adream library and activity card that could be used on mobile devices. These are all integrated on Adream Box website, making Adream Teacher and volunteer be more convenient to learn Adream Curriculum knowledge, to get Adream’ s activity news, to sign up to join it and to give on-time feedback. Some of the applications has already been published. In addition to independent research and

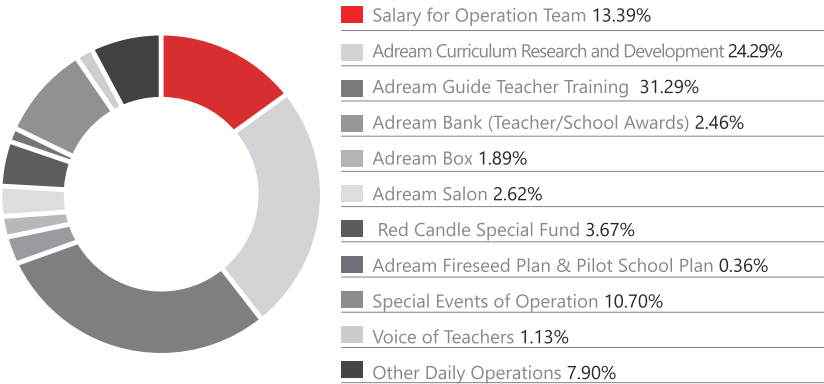
development, we also used the third-party platform to launch a small program named “Adream Growth Institute” based on WeChat. It provided online curriculum, live show training and sharing stories from Adream Teacher, and got 20,000 visits per month.

In 2018, Adream Box once again faced a hacker attack, resulting in spam on the site. Therefore, we made a lot of optimizations in the security of the entire IT system, improving our security protection capabilities by purchasing cloud standard security services, filtering sensitive words and increasing warning information. Besides, we were still faced with the problem of insufficient related staffs. In 2018, in case of the lack on full-time online operation staffs, active rate of the Adream Box user decreased, and the Adream Center operation data weren’ t collected on time. Facing difficulties, we would continue to timely reflect, calmly respond, and meet and apply new technology to iterate operational services.

Community Adream Center Project

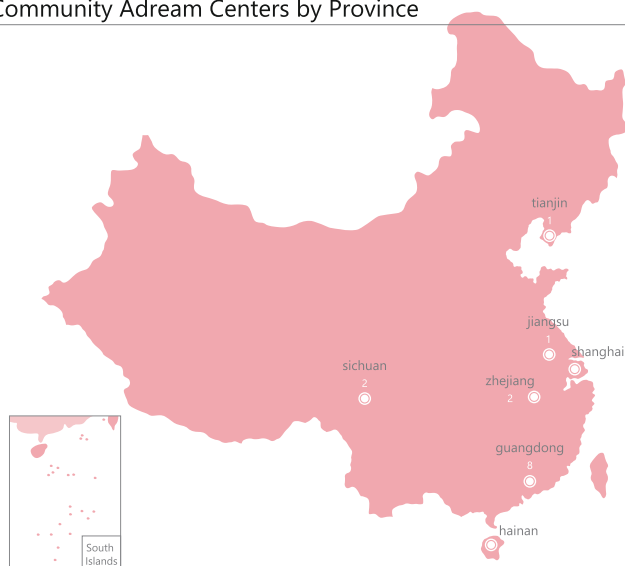
In 2016, Adream published Community Adream Center which used community as unit, and extended the concept of whole-person education to community, letting more urban, rural youth and their family enjoy competency-based education curriculum and activities just at their home, which accelerated the merge of children and families, promoted the interaction relationship and strengthened community residents, social volunteers and parents' enthusiasm to participate into community activities.

In 2018, Adream explored a standardized model of joint funding from the foundation, government, and social resources, and cooperated with local community youth social organizations to adopt the "weekend + summer vacation" dual-shift system. Three community Adream Centers were newly built in Wuxi Sumiao, Chengdu Chonghua, Shanghai Puxing, and 19 community Adream Centers were totally constructed and operated in major cities across the country. Meanwhile, we also started to build the 1.0 edition community Adream Curriculum system, finished community optimization of four school Adream Curriculums and introduced 2 curriculum, Community Parents Class and Community Creation.

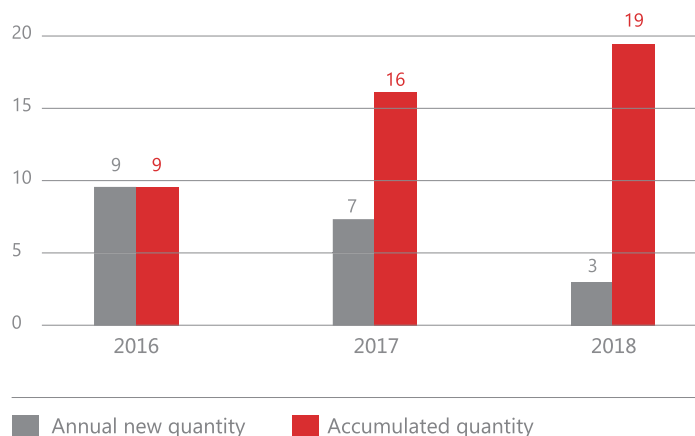
The landing of Community Adream Center provided a high-quality competency-based education service point to the community. In 2019, Community Adream Center would promote deep diving into this country, exploring models and methodology suitable for local Chinese children's education and creating a good community education.

Adream Caravan

Cooperating with Suning, Adream put forward “Adream Caravan” Program in 2015. “Adream Caravan” is the movable Adream Center, which contains multiple functions such as science laboratory, arts classroom, movable reading room and movable cinema. Through movable communication methods, more interesting and special theme courses for more children are designed in remote areas, such as technological innovation, art appreciation and national culture.

By the end of 2018, the cumulative journey of Adream Caravan has reached 100,000 kilometers, and it has gone through 58 cities in 18 provinces across this country, providing lively and interesting courses and the chances for more than 30,000 students in rural area to explore future. In 2018, the Adream Caravan set off from Heilongjiang Province that was at the northeast edge to the Mongolian prairie in the north, then to the Xinjiang in the northwest and the beautiful Qinghai-Tibet Plateau, through Yunnan, Fujian, and finally to Jiangsu, bringing various vivid curriculums to more than 5000 students in remote mountains and helping them broaden their horizons and see this world, as well as inspiring their cognition and imagination.

In 2019, Adream Caravan will continue to go on, and it would be combined with Hometown and Community curriculum and e-commerce poverty alleviation, to support goals and intelligence. We will continuously build a regional deep diving platform comprehensively, cooperating with other partners and empowering educators. The goals belong to children while Competency-based Education owns intelligence. Adream will help more children grow up with full of value.

Looking into the Future Education Institute

2018 is the year for Looking into the Future Education Institute to assure the think tank and explore the operating model. We identified a development orientation centered on children and published five major children’s academic research topics on “Looking into the Future: Children Think Tank Launching Ceremony & First Children’s Think Tank Summit”, including “The Historical Origin and Formation of Contemporary Children’s Views”, “Children and Time”, “Children and Space”, “Global Children Think Tank Scan”, “The application of Children’s wisdom”. The forum attracted more than 100 education experts from all

over the country to jointly advocate the concept and practice of child-centered education. Besides, at the 4th China Education Innovation Achievements Public Welfare Expo, we held the first international education forum in China with the theme of “Research and Practical Application of Children’s Perspectives”. It gathered experts and scholars altogether to have an academic and practical communication from children’s perspective.

Regarding “Children’s Perspective, Looking into the Future” as its mission, Looking into the Future Institute will continuously start innovative, useful, sustainable development research from children’s perspective, aimed at building a cross-fields, co-created and advanced children’s education research platform.

Learning Community Institute

As the mission of “to guarantee high quality learning rights for every child”, as the core of “listening equally” and “mutual correlation”, Learning Community Institute was built to promote the overall structural reform of education.

In 2018, setting Shanghai as its basis, Learning Community Institute conducted action research in front-line classrooms and promoted the theory and practice of learning community. The cooperative schools were spread across 27 province, cities and autonomous regions across the country. A total of 8 national conferences were held throughout the year, and 42 regional visits and surveys were completed. The cumulative number of participants in the offline conference was over 3000 and number of online live events was 50. The cooperation with 8 counties and municipal governments was established to cultivate 5 courses integrated model school. Moreover, it was the first time for the national learning community innovation literacy forum to be organized by students from the learning community high school experimental class. Students published a critique and outlook on education reform, forming a new paradigm for students to participate in and promote curriculum reform. We cooperated with China Teacher News to hold of “Learning Community, Curriculum Reform in China” for 7 times, created a case study method based on “Focusing on Student’s Learning Process and Key Time Reconstruction” (LOCA), and guided the basic education reform in the country.

Adream's Cooperated Programs

Special Funds

Adream set up special fund at the end of 2015. As a strategic cooperation and innovative financing business, special fund adhered to Adream's charitable concept, and together with all partners to advocate Competency-based Education by jointly designing charitable products, jointly raising funds to expand service network, and co-creating brand to development, aimed at working together to create sustainable, replicable, evaluable, socially influential brand charitable projects.

Meanwhile, Adream would provide professional services such as project implementation and management, information transparency and risk control to our special fund partners, promoting special fund grow with sustainability and high quality.

By the end of 2018, Adream has co-created 22 special funds with well-known enterprises, NPO and individuals such as Anta, Master Kang, Mary Kay, Bearer, Cheng Fund, Kuzhi Yucai School and Aling Gong. Three years of accumulated fundraising reached 48.02 million RMB, which directly benefitted 660,000 people.

"Deep Diving, Improve Quality" is the core strategy of Adream Special Fund to insist. After several years of development, some special funds began to show their brand influence. In 2018, a total of 7 special funds won various awards in 10 industries, which enhanced the visibility and brand reputation of special funds in the specific field.

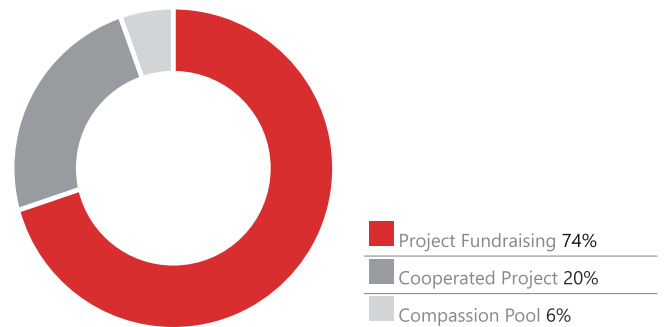


Huodui Charity

Huodui Charity was an internet service platform firstly established and operated independently in 2015 by Adream. It was designed to help start-up NGOs, individuals or organizations who have charitable faith to provide fundraising, consulting and other services to promote the cultivation and development of charitable talents. In 2018, Huodui Charity built “Fulipai Workshop” in 27 provinces (cities and autonomous region) and came to empower small charitable organizations by providing training. During this year, together with 200 NGOs, nearly 250 charitable projects were launched, and a total of 78000 donations were donated to 9 million RMB.

In terms of product iteration, we have docked a number of partners, expanded the income donation, forwarded donations and activity donations, completed the reconstruction of the payment system and access authorization system, and further improved the operational performance and safety of platform.

United Fundraising

In 2018, Adream Actively united with educational charitable partners developed online fundraising to promote the development of public welfare filed. “Adream Educational Line” received more than 2.08 million funded support from 23 companies and foundations. A total of 79 educational social organizations were jointly organized, and 101 public welfare projects fundraised online for the public. A total of 13.75 million RMB was raised, and more than 1.11 million people participated in the donation.

In 2019, Adream will continuously provide support including fundraising, branding, professional abilities improving to every excellent educational social organizations by Adream Educational Line, attracting more enterprises, foundations and public who are interested in the development of education to promote Chinese public welfare business.



Innovative Project

Jilin Adream Youth Care Center

It all started with the cooperation between Adream and Jilin Orphan School Adream Center. During these two years, Jilin orphan school has raised complete middle and primary school Competency-based Curriculum system.

Adhered to the mission of helping each child to grow with confidence, calmness and dignity and letting the children of orphan school become healthier, happier, more caring, more adaptable to society, and have possibility to have a more diversified future development, in 2018, with the support of the Civil Affairs Department of Jilin Province, Adream established Jilin Adream Youth Care Center. (Hereinafter referred to as Care Center).

2018 is the year of gathering resources and attention for Care Center. The purpose of the Care Center is to provide humanistic care and psychological consoling to orphan groups in Jilin Provinces, to improve the overall quality of orphan groups and provide services for the improvement of the related staffs. Not only can Care Center bring Adream Curriculum to children in orphan school, but we can also organize hundreds of students to take part in arts summer camp. The activities brought different growth experiences to children and accompanied teachers. Through the display of brush and the children themselves, children's innocence and self-confidence children were released.



Party branch construction

Remain true to our original aspiration and keep the mission firmly in mind.

Since the establishment of Adream, we have highly focused on party construction. At the Council level, we recommend our first supervisor as the communicator of party construction, organizing party activities regularly and learning from the party spirit. In 2016, we established the first independent party branch of non-governmental foundation in Shanghai. Under the leadership of the party branch secretary, the party members actively bring the backbone force into full play, promoting the party branch construction that owns the characteristics of social organization.

Remain true to our original aspiration and deeply cultivate dream.

In February, 2018, Adream held the party construction activity named "Remain True to Our Original Aspiration and Deeply Cultivate Dream". Luoqing Wang (Director of Social Work Department, United Front Department, Shanghai Municipal Committee), Yonghe Zeng (Deputy Director of Shanghai Social Organization Management Bureau), Lixiong Chen (Vice Chairman of Shanghai Zhangjiang District Committee and director of Party Committee Office) and members of Shanghai new Social class Friendship Association attended this activity. Director Wang mentioned that the party branches of social organization should perform as fighting bastions, and each member should play the leading role.

Take root in the front line, take targeted measures in poverty alleviation and support wisdom by education

To achieve the goal of completing the building of a moderately prosperous society in all respects in 2020, Adream actively responds to the call for accurate poverty alleviation. We take Adream Course as carrier to promote the systematization of the open of schooled-based curriculum as well as the leapfrog development of competency-based education in rural areas in China. The year 2018 was not only the tenth year since competency-based education was promoted by Adream, but also the tenth year since Adream took targeted measures in poverty alleviation to achieve China Dream. Depending on support and leadership from party and nation, Adream has helped 3.6 million children gain the first experience of competency-based education. We have cooperated with enterprises to participate in targeted poverty alleviation in over 50 poverty-stricken countries and empower local educators, providing high-quality education resources to local areas by applying Adream Center program. Meanwhile, we take part in fixed support projects Aid Tibet, Aid Xinjiang and Aid Yunnan, etc., actively promoting the construction to community, suburb and counterpart support areas and performing the power belonging to social organization party branch, aimed at offering better service to local areas.

Lead the party construction and realize bilateral improvement

As the representative of non-governmental foundation, Adream Party Branch wants to be the model of social organization's party construction in new generation. In 2019, under the leadership of CPC, we will continue to construct and perfect the learning system, to further improve branch members and to open various activities related to party construction regularly.

Adream Internal Support System

Adream Center Program

Up to the end of 2018, Adream maintains 103 full-time staffs (including 66 Foundation staffs, 31 Shanghai Charity Development Center staffs and 6 Jilin Charity Development Center Staffs). The headcount is 126 (including volunteers' service period, consultants, workforce donated by partners), and the per capita efficiency value for full-time employees reached RMB 1.41 million. In 2018, we recruited altogether 60 new employees, and the retention rate of new employees was 83%. It's because we focus more on employee's individual development and the establishment of cultural brand that about 20 employees quitted from jobs, with the demission rate of 21%, having reached the lowest point in the past three years. A great number of new employees brought not only fresh thoughts and vigor to Adream but also higher challenges to internal training, personal training and career planning.

In 2018, we upgraded human resource department to organization development department. We chose human development strategies according to the development of organization. Sticking to the principles of establishing organizational culture, gathering consensus of actions and stimulating creativity, we established the online Adream information communication and sharing platform and started "one-on-one training plan" in middle level, etc., which further improved the leadership of young management groups, promoting people's development in various ways.

Internal management

In 2018, based on policies and laws as well as requirement of quality system, Adream steadily improved internal management and continued to perfect management system. With the development of original business and broadening of new business, we concluded audit based on ISO and important financial audit into daily work. Also, we hope employees' rule-obeying conscious as well as quality conscious can be improved by audit. Each core business department sorted out and published Working Handbook, aimed at conducting departments' work clearly and effectively, making sure the accumulation of knowledge while helping beginners adapt to work, which decreased the cost caused by the flow of members.

Meanwhile, to meet the demands of internal management, we changed the internal OA office system in 2018, reorganized the business process based on system logics and recognized significant control points. By doing this, we perfected internal program-management, personal authorization, data collection and information feedback, etc. Besides, the efficiency was improved by using system and the real and complete data was presented, which meant that we realized process transparency. The new OA office system will be formally published in 2019. In addition, we finished the development of core accounts system technology, making accounts belong to different systems in Adream assess to each other and be able to share data with each other.

2018 Report of Board of Supervisors

The board of supervisors held two conferences in February and April respectively in 2018. In February, the board reviewed a proposal named Shanghai Adream Moral Regulations V1.1. In April, the board attended re-election of council, making sure the re-election was held according to rules, and held the third election of supervisor, recommending Sufen Zheng as the supervisor, and also deeply discussed the conference motivation system.

According to the Articles of Association of the Foundation, the Board oversees the compliance of the Foundation's annual operations and management in previous years. The 2018 report is as follows:

1. Adream execute council held four conferences in 2018, one of which was re-election. Members from the board of supervisors attended all the conferences mentioned above, making sure that the procedure and proposal obey laws and rules.

2. On February 6th, 2018, Tianzhi international accounting firm was employed as the audit organization in re-election in the procedure of the Tenth Conference of the Second Board and the members of re-election leader team were announced.

3. On April 22nd, 2018, we elected Jiangxue Pan to be the councilor, Chong Wu as the vice councilor and Yanhui Su as the secretary-

general. Jiangxue Pan, Chong Wu, Yanhui Su, Man Liu, Bin Hu, Shu Chen, Jin He, Zipei Xu and Yu Shen were nominated as members of council in the next three sessions. Sufen Zheng, Yuan Liu, Junming Shi and Jin Chen were the supervisors in the next three sessions.

4. 2018 Adream Annual Financial Audit Report was discussed and passed by e-mail.

The in-kind donation decreased, and we should focus more on evaluation of value, quality and the foundation's purpose of in-kind donation.

2. The scale of members and business has been increasingly enlarged. The foundation should take actions to realize the sustainable development of talents. With the limited members and resources, we should focus more on our tasks and strategies, maintaining the balance between do and not-to-do as well as high-level management of organization.

3. The Foundation's website was attacked again in 2018. Thus, it's necessary to promote the achievement of foundation's tasks and targets by using the power of internet. It's high time that the foundation improved the internet security.

2019 Strategic Summary

After a decade's development, we summarized Adream's first principle, that is, "Effective Love", to focus on Competency-based Education and to promote social progress with education. As a non-profit organization, we choose to use rational mind to promote the achievement of love and dream under the idealistic public welfare reality. At the crossroads of strategic transformation, we choose to change to go deep diving from high speed network expansion in the past ten years. If we regard incremental education as to use Competency-based Education for children to look into the future, then today we should face the stocking adult education. Only educators who have independent personality, open vision, enrich inside and love-sharing could cultivate children with confidence, pleasure and dignity.

In 2019, to accompany educators, upgrade educators and empower educators is the mission that must be completed for us and will be reached in next 10 years.

1. Ten-year polished public welfare product: "Adream Center" Competency-based public welfare service system. In 2019, 350-400 newly Adream Centers will be built, and we would promote Adream Center 7.0 Edition to combine precision poverty alleviation and strategic cooperation areas to develop steadily. Focusing on building three quality courses, "Going to the Distance", "Love and Dream", "Technology Innovator" will be developed according to different cognitive levels and abilities between urban students and rural students. By doing teacher training, curriculum activities and effect evaluation, the amount of curriculum will be increased and the quality of it will be improved, and the Adream Curriculum will be promoted to be involved in the local comprehensive practice class.

2. Adream will deep diving into the operation services in 100 districts and counties, build reproducible supervision system and "local distributor" strategy. By using methods like provincial course competition, provincial promotion, from point to area, we will show that specific area could push the viscosity and enthusiasm for the implementation of the Adream Curriculum in the whole country. "Taishan Plan", the depth first-line regional research project, is going to be published to shape the investigation report by using county as a unit. It could be used to summarize successful experience, providing strong guidance to upgrading Adream Center operation services. "Adream Experimental School" will be landed, from the class reform to the school culture, to penetrate our educational value with "Truth, Love, Chasing Dream" to the front-line educational reform, which means that Adream are highly recognized by the system in educational professional level, and that also means an unprecedented depth of cultivation of a non-profit organization in the field of education.

3. Adream will focus on building the physical Adream education training institute for adult to empower educator with the core of "Love", aimed at integrating the enterprise, the government, the social organization, the university and the public to make connections, arise and stimulate inner power of teachers, to absorb and deliver the education of love by systematic training and companionship. This is

the second curve for us to investigate Competency-based Education and to draw a perfect growth curve. we need to be patience and perseverance.

4. To achieve public welfare transparency 4.0 edition through the power of information technology, we will try to investigate block chain technology, completing a closed loop from multiple resource donations to beneficiary services from school lifecycle to teacher lifecycle, and then to course data, which will guide us to iteratively complete internal management with real and effective data, and to make our donor's good intention to achieve the most efficient output with our professional and detailed public welfare services.

To build sustainable structure of organization and strategy for talent development, Adream will not only take innovative project as the starting point to practice our talents but also take organizational change as the opportunity to cultivate talents. The general knowledge base and systematic training resource system will be built to cultivate knowledgeable and cohesive middle managers by "One-on-one Coach" training. culture and the talent will be the first factor to be considered, and the organization can be developed in a long term.

Adream Foundation is just like a university, as we cultivate talents for the public welfare fields and infuse our love and energy into the educational filed. We are proud of it. Bravery, responsibility, open-mind, innovation, cross-filed, empowerment... Duty and Mission, when we really expect for them, we believe that angels will appear in the future. Thanks for the accompany and care from all the Adream Family members. Because of you, Adream have enough perseverance and belief to go on in the next new ten years. Because of you, we can be calm and firm with love for dream.

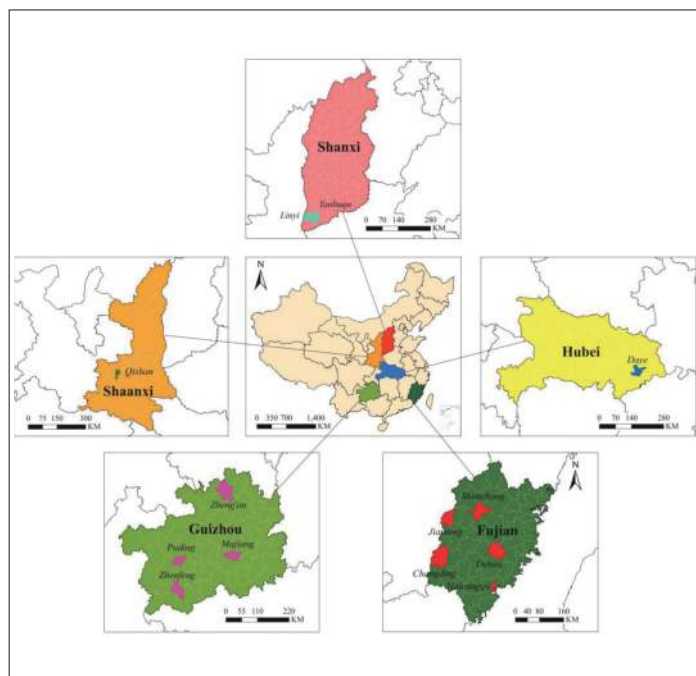
Overview and Expectation in assessment Report from External Professional Institutes

Since establishment, Adream has kept perfecting competency-based education service system with the core of Adream Center. To applying highly-professional management and sustainable support for business-running, I pay high attention to the construction and running of Adream Center, as well as training and applying of Adream Courses, and set quantized evaluation criteria. Besides, we gradually introduce third party professional institutes to give an assessment, helping us know the achievement during work, discover strategies and problems during the process of running the system, and also raise useful suggestions to make it more perfect.

Evaluation of Adream Center

At the end of 2013, we invited Agricultural Policy Research Center in Chinese Academy of Science, Education Experimental Economy Research Institute in Shaanxi Normal University and REAP group from Stanford University to give the third-party assessment that has lasted for three years, aimed at analyzing the influence caused by Adream Center to children's growth and teacher and both influential mechanism by scientific and strict assessment. Based on this, the experience of Adream Center project was concluded, providing practical solid evidence to further perfect the project.

The assessment samples cover 166 primary schools, junior high schools and nine-year schools in 5 provinces and 13 counties and districts. 85 of them are intervened by Adream, running Adream Center project during assessment. 81 of them are chosen near the intervened schools by assessment groups, whose situation is similar to intervened schools.



The assessment group used the unified assessment tools. They investigated all students, headteachers, math teachers, school-based or practical curriculum teachers, Adream teachers and headmasters from sample classes in all schools by baseline survey, mid-term tracking, terminal tracking and in-depth interview. The method chosen to assess the performance of school by assessment group was standardized math grade, which is widely-used in assessment. Meanwhile, they used the psychological scale recommended by adviser in Adream external assessment project to measure the students' non-academic performance.

According to the analyzation of assessment:

1: The intervened students: there was a slight improvement in their math grades, on the average of improvement of 2 points (the full score is 100). Students' concept of money and right was obviously improved. The result explains that the Adream courses in Adream Center project provided active and easy atmosphere during class and pluralistic content in class, which

stimulated the students' activeness and interest to study. Therefore, their grades and living skills were improved.

2: The intervened teachers: There were no obvious active influences on job burnout, job efficiency, performance, meaning and happiness of job. It's perhaps because teacher's psychological condition is affected by their life and various kinds of work. Their psychological pressure caused by work and life cannot be eliminated in short term if they are only trained to make themselves perform well in Adream courses.

Therefore, the start of Adream Center stimulated students' interest to study and improve their practical skills. To some extent, it can make children to feel happy, fair and confident. However, to achieve the expected goal, except for the design of content and training of Adream teachers, it still requires the frequency of opening class and effect form students, teachers, parents, school leaders and bureau of education.

The assessment of Adream Course.

The assessment of Adream course is now concluded into the period of designing and running courses. The process of "encouraging construction by assessment" is formed. The 2.0 core Adream course is under design now, which is required to collect suggestions after a simple assessment and regulate the courses in the first term. Then the pilot assessment period comes, we will make an improvement on study after getting information about making changes, and formally enter the quality tracking period. We hope that such a division of phases will directly improve the running of project, instead of making it at once.

Since 2017, Adream has invited Beijing Yide Social Working Development Organization to make experimental assessment of the influence, running condition, perfecting condition, simple test, investigation and half-pilot of Adream courses. We try to know it from the perspective of courses research: whether the design of Adream courses can prove the original intervened assumption, whether there is a practical improvement of teachers' and student competency-based skills. Compared with the teachers and students who haven't experienced the Adream courses, whether their changes can be measured has a significant meaning in statistics. Except for data dimension, whether there are differences in spiritual condition, situation and concept.

1、Spring term in 2017: the influence of two core courses in Adream course 2.0 stage: Going the Distance and Love and Dream1 were assessed by the experimental courses. The methods chosen to assess it id quantified questionnaire analyzation and qualitative research methods, including investigation, in-depth interview and focused groups to give feedbacks between students and teachers, as well as collection related to funds and surveys.

Going the Distance Curriculum interviewed Teachers and students that covered all the 10 started provinces, including Yunnan, Sichuan, Shaanxi, Shanxi, Jiangsu, Jilin, Hunan, Guizhou, Gansu, Fujian.

Teachers thought this course would stimulate students to be independent and self-learning. The open and team-based curriculum also increased student interaction patterns. For themselves, they could grow with their students, as well as broaden the horizon and learn advanced knowledge and thought.

The students thought Going the Distance brought opportunities for them to show their own opinions, and those opinion would all be encouraged once they said. They could practice and explore it in this curriculum, which was the idealistic type of curriculum. And for the teacher who taught Going the Distance was also their idealistic type of teacher who wouldn't exist in the common curriculum. As for Love and Dream Curriculum, we chose teachers and students in 9 classes from 42 started classes in different provinces, cities and autonomous region to carry out an investigation.

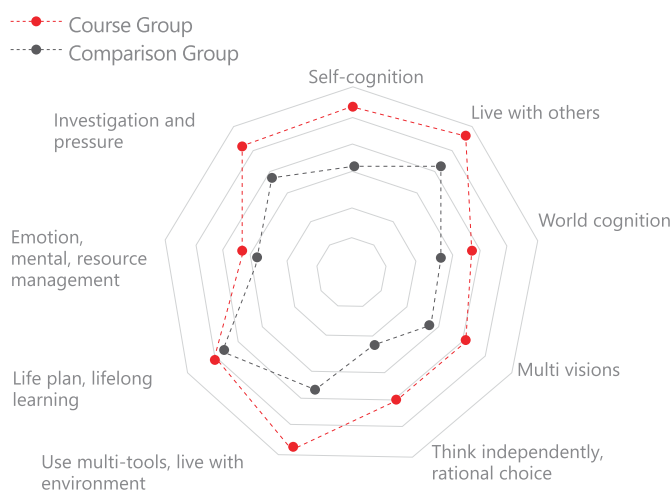
From teachers' perspective, Love and Dream helps them to gain more

opportunities to get in touch with new knowledges and other teachers from different geographical fields. By learning the new teaching method, they are more possible to get rid of solely teaching subjects and learn how to teach well on the innovative curriculum under interdisciplinary background, emerging the useful elements from Adream Curriculum to their regular taught curriculum and bringing all of them to those classes which haven't experienced Adream Curriculum. Therefore, the radiation effects of Adream Curriculum will be more widely spread.

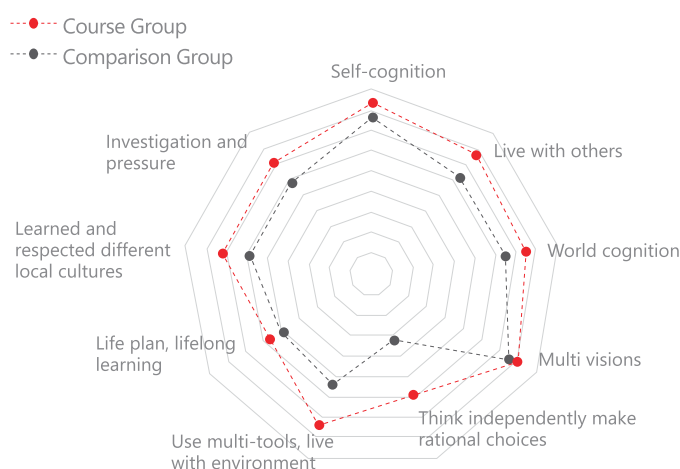
From students' perspective, they feel that this curriculum is very fun. This curriculum has many different fresh elements. What is beyond our expectation is even some of primary students from grade 1 or grade 2 could say some mature words such as investigation or new knowledge to describe what they gain.

These two curriculums bring experiences for teachers and children to grow up together, improving understanding of love and travelling skills and helping each other get a more harmonious relationship and identity. Compared to Comparison Group, these two curriculums help teachers in Course Group to break through the limitation of teaching methods, as well as to improve their teaching philosophy and skills. Meanwhile, the significant aspects for Course Group children to improve the abilities of independent thinking, rational choice, using multi-tools, integrating with environment, getting along with others and fighting against pressure. From these two courses, we can realize that when all other variables are controlled, the students who have taken dream courses tend to gain a higher score when compared with those who haven't taken the courses. Besides, the results are statistically significant and prove the value of dream curriculum from data level.

2. 2017 Full Semester: Implemented normal curriculum assessment on Going the Distance, Love and Dream 1 and Love and Dream 2; Technology Innovator and Career Life was under first evaluation; International Understanding was under course integrity test. The course survey method was the pre-test questionnaire for students at the beginning of the semester, student post-test questionnaires implemented centrally at the end of the semester, Adream Teacher semi-structural interview, admission to school, etc.

In the competency-based ability scale test of Career Life, for students in course team, the scores in total nine categories were all higher than comparison team students, and the difference in all items reached a statistically significant level. Among them, the most outstanding abilities were thinking independently, rational choice, worldwide recognition, life planning and life-long study.

In addition to survey's quantitative feedback, in the on-the-job interviews in the field, the difference between course group children and comparison group children that the investigators observed, and teachers noticed were obvious.

Investigators reflected that students in course group had clear mind and had their own opinions to the questions. The most intuitive feeling during their talk was they all had a clearer understanding and plan for their future, and the strength of learning was also quite sufficient. They had a general mind to the career and life plan, "They thought life plan is quite significant".

Teachers reflected that children became politer, and they were more willing to communicate with their head teacher. The classmates were more willing to help each other, and the discipline in class was better than ever before. They could manage their own emotion, and had obvious changes in self-thinking, comprehension, life planning. "Students had a strong sense of teamwork and were willing to share. They knew how to respect others, and learnt to overcome difficulties and distinguish between good and bad. Students became more confident and had confidence to face the future."

For the on-campus interview of Technology Innovator, the investigator and the taught teacher's experience focused on the achievement of the children through the course. Self-recognition of course group children became higher. Therefore, they had more inspiration spirits. Their hands-on ability and cooperation ability were also improved. They were more willing to express their thought, instead of following their teachers without self-thinking. The innovative thought and logical thinking ability were both improved. They learnt physical knowledge, electronic products, and other extracurricular knowledge through this curriculum.

Besides, During the assessment process, we found that the fundamental information directly exported by Adream Box existed some mistakes or missing information. In the future, we would upgrade the data collecting ability of Adream Box, so that the data can be crawled in a timely and effective manner.

3. 2018 Spring Semester and Fall Semester: The spring semester assessment course were Dream Stage and Financial Awareness. Both of courses were implemented a simplified assessment. The fall semester assessment course was Dream Stage, which conducted observation evaluation. Meanwhile, Financial Awareness and International Understanding conducted semi-pilot evaluation. The related report hadn't done so far, and the evaluation result would come out in 2019.

Adream-Mei linkai Promising Future Special Fund assessment to competency-based education

Shanghai Adream Charity Fund-Mei linkai Promising Future Special Fund was established in January in 2017, aimed at offering support to female teenagers in required areas and promoting the development of competency-based education for female students, making them grow up with confidence, calmness and dignity, and obtain a brighter future.

In 2018, Adream invited Beijing Yide Social Work Development Center to do investigation to this special fund for half a year from March to September, which mainly focused on training for teachers and teaching application for Promising Future in spring term in 2018, aimed at getting the feedbacks from teachers and students and to realize the influence and changes that course brought to them.

As we focus on the in-depth reasons of social problems and demands, participation, suggestion and opinion of beneficiaries themselves, there has been special characteristic on assessment project since the primary stage, so that we adopt diversified assessment methods.

As for construction of logic frame, we chose CIPP Assessment Mode. During specific supervision and examination, we borrowed OM tools to separate the goal of each stage, partner and interest-related party, and predetermined result. Also, we set the phased symbol during process.

Meanwhile, as for the assessment on teachers and students' change, we used Competency-based scale in questionnaire. When getting the feedbacks from teachers and students, we adopted personal interview and focused group to do research. When measuring the influence brought by gender education, we adopted Class Friendship Online analyzation. When analyzing ample and data, we adopted analyzing methods under half-experimental condition.

After following, supervising and making multi-assessment for nearly half a year, the assessment indicated three characteristics in this project:

The unified concept, strategy and action.

The rooted research, experiment and supervision.

The appearance of integration, change and opportunity.

This evaluation project conducted by Adream and Mary Kay is an additive cooperation with our respective strengths. Adream's several years of theoretical research, theoretical advocacy and action experience in competency-based education filed, plus with Mary Kay's institutional traits that focus on women's perspectives and corporate values based on love, making this project possible to firstly build a charitable branding as a competency-based curriculum towards youth female, which fulfills the blank

area. For the effect and influence of gender education, the class friendship network analysis in social network analysis was adopted; statistical analysis under the semi-experimental condition was used in sample processing and data analysis.

After nearly 6 months of tracking, monitoring and cross-use of multiple evaluation research methods, the evaluation found that,

this project presents the following three characteristics:

Unity of philosophy, strategy and action

Application of research, experiment and monitoring

Emergence of integration, change and opportunity

This evaluation project is a "additional" cooperation between Adream and the Mary Kay Foundation in their respective areas of advantage. Adream has many years of theoretical research, idea advocacy and action experience in the field of literacy education, combined with Mary Kay's institutional traits that emphasize women's perspective and the corporate value of "taking love as the basis", which gives the project the opportunity to create a public welfare brand for adolescent girls' literacy courses to fill the gaps in this field.



The expectation of Adream's assessment in the future

For a long time, Adream has actively participated in assessment and has gradually categorized the scientific third-party assessment into Adream's standard process. We regard assessment as an important way to find, diagnose and solve problems. Therefore, assessment should be systematically started with project period and become an indispensable part of project. For us, the goal that assessment can be achieved in three stages from microcosm to macroscope:

Improve the specific work in executive level. Put forward practical improved suggestion.

Realize beneficiary's satisfaction degree and related feedbacks. Reflect effect to contributive party.

Collect a great amount of data and find valuable information consensus. Make an influence on social policy.

It is still a huge challenge for non-profit organizations to self-examine, improve efficiency, improve public welfare projects, and implement policy advocacy through evaluation. Thankfully, all responsible parties of Adream have great enthusiasm, courage and patience in the course of this experiment. The current preliminary evaluation results are also very positive, which preliminarily proves that Adream can have a positive impact on the students, teachers and schools served by the Adream system. Adream looks forward to not only telling what is done through stories, but also to describe the changes brought about by numbers. We hope that our efforts can bring some special reference to the educational public welfare of China.

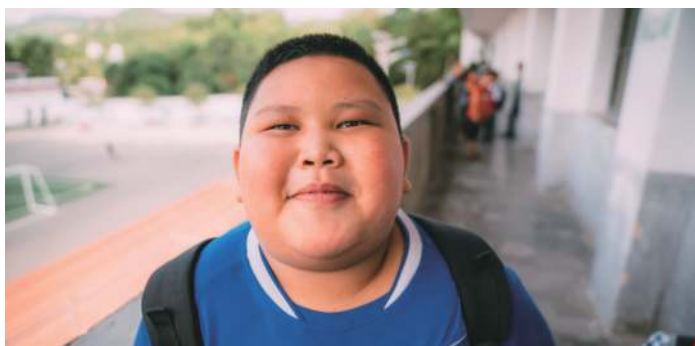

I .Audit Opinion

We have audited financial statements of Adream Foundation (hereinafter referred to as “foundation”), including balance sheet on December 31, 2018 and statement of operating activities and notes to financial statements of 2018.

We believe the attached financial statements of foundation were prepared according to Accounting System of Non-Governmental Non-profit Organization. The financial situation of foundation on December 31, 2018 and the operating outcomes in 2018 were reflected in all significant aspects.

As for the foundation, public welfare expenditure in 2018 totaled RMB 125,220,809.25, and the total amount of incomes in 2017 was RMB 153,741,585.46, of which the proportion of public welfare expenditure in 2018 in total amount of incomes in 2017 was 81.45%. In 2018, the amount of wages & benefits of administrative personnel was RMB 6,298,747.83 and amount of administration and office expenditures was RMB 1,119,400.09, of which the total amount should be RMB 7,418,147.92, accounting for 5.41% of the total amount of expenditures in 2018, namely RMB 137,234,180.53.

II. Basis of Audit Opinions’ Formation

And design, implementation and maintenance of necessary internal controls for the purpose can ensure that there is no misstatement caused by any fraud or error.

When preparing financial reports, management is in charge of evaluating the sustainable operation ability, revealing the related issues with sustainable operation ability, and applying going under assumption. Unless the management has the plan of liquidation、terminating the operation or no other realistic choices.

Government is in charge of supervising the process of preparing foundation’ s financial reports.

Notes to financial Statements

December 31st, 2018

1. Basic Information of Company

Adream Foundation (hereinafter referred to as "the foundation") is a non-public raising foundation founded on August 14, 2008 with the approval document numbered Hu Min Zhi Fa [2008] No.11 issued by Shanghai Civil Affairs Bureau and has been granted Registration Certificate of Legal Entity of Foundation numbered Hu Ji Zheng Zi No. 0087, Organization Code Certificate of the foundation: 50178073-8. As for the foundation, the amount of the original fund is RMB 2 million and legal representative is: Pan Jiangxue.

Reviewed and approved at the second council meeting of the second session of council of the foundation, the nature of the foundation has been changed from local non-public raising foundation to local public raising foundation, which Beijing Property and Credit Group served as the capital contributor and invested additional RMB 2 million into the original fund. Approved by the Letter of Decision on Approval of Registration Charge numbered Hu Min She Deng [2014] No. D042 issued by Shanghai Civil Affairs Bureau and Shanghai Administration Bureau of NGOs, the foundation was granted Registration Certificate of Legal Entity of Foundation numbered Hu Ji Zheng Zi No. 0087 on January 26, 2014.

On May 14, 2018, the foundation renewed Registration Certificate of Legal Entity of Foundation, whose unified social credit code was 53310000501780738C and period of validity was from May 14, 2018 to April 22, 2021.

The foundation serves as a public raising foundation and its business scope covers: providing help and support to the poor; providing assistance in improvement to educational facilities; providing financial support to quality and competence-oriented education; promoting employment; Providing financial support to the development of public welfare organizations.

II. Basis for Preparation of Financial Statements

The foundation prepares financial statements according to Requirements of Accounting System of Non-governmental Non-profit Organization.

III. Description of Important Accounting Policies and Accounting Estimates

(I) Accounting Period

An accounting year refers to the period from January 1st to December 31st based on the Gregorian calendar.

(II) Base Currency for Bookkeeping

RMB is adopted by the foundation as the base currency for bookkeeping

(III) Bookkeeping Basis& Principle of valuation

The accrual basis of accounting is adopted by the foundation as its bookkeeping basis. When measuring accounting elements, the foundation generally adopts historical cost. As for any circumstance in which replacement cost, act realizable value, present value or other nature is used for measurement based on Accounting System of Non- governmental Non-profit Organization, the foundation will provide special description.

(IV) Criteria for Recognition of Cash & Cash equivalent

When cash flow statement is prepared, cash on hand and deposit that can be used to make payment in anytime should be recognized as cash. Those investments which meet four conditions including short period (generally becoming due within three months since date of purchase), high liquidity, easy conversion to a known amount of cash and very low risk of value change should be recognized as cash equivalents.

(V) Foreign Currency transactions

As for economic transactions involving foreign currency, the foundation should conduct bookkeeping based on the amount of RMB converted from foreign currency according to market exchange rate (middle rate) published by the People's Bank of China. All foreign currency assets and liabilities should be adjusted at the end of the period based on the market middle rate of RMB published by the People's Bank of China. Difference of exchange relevant to assets meeting conditions of capitalization should be capitalized and added to value of relevant assets.

(VI) Recognition of Donated Assets

Cash assets donated to the foundation should be recorded according to the actually received amount. As for non-cash assets donated to the foundation, such as short-term investment, inventory, long-term investment, fixed assets and intangible assets, value for bookkeeping should be determined based on the following methods.

1. If the donor provides relevant document (such as invoice, customs declaration, relevant agreement, etc.), the amount indicated on such document should be regarded as the value for bookkeeping. In case of a relatively big difference between the amount indicated on such document and the fair value of any donated asset, fair value of such donated asset should be deemed as the actual cost of such asset.

2. If the donor doesn't provide any relevant document, donated asset should be recorded based on its fair value.

(VII) Receivables

Receivables refer to various uncollected creditor's rights receivable occurring in the process of daily operating activities of the foundation, which should be recorded based on the actual account.

At the end of each accounting period, recoverability of receivable should be analyzed, based on which is referred as any possible loss on bad debts. Bad debt reserves should be calculated and drawn based on the specific identification method and loss on bad debts should be recognized and recorded as current expense.

Criteria for recognition of loss on bad debts:

In case of bankruptcy or death of a debtor, those receivables that cannot be recovered by his/her bankruptcy assets or heritage should be recognized as loss on bad debts.

In case of failure of a debtor in fulfilling his/ her obligation for paying a debt, those receivables that cannot be recovered beyond three years and will not be recovered based on obvious evidences should be recognized as loss on bad debts.

According to the administration authority of the foundation, bad debts can be recognized as loss on bad debts based on approval of the council, for which the drawn bad debt reserves should be written off.

Accounting method for bad debts: The allowance method should be adopted as the accounting method for bad debts.

(VIII) Inventory

1. Categorization of Inventory

Inventory refers to finished products or goods held by the foundation in daily activities for sale or production materials, supplies or goods for sale or donation, or to be consumed in production, supply of service or daily management.

Inventory includes: material in transit, goods in stock, etc.

2. Inventory Valuation Method

When inventory is obtained, the initial measurement should be conducted based on its costs, including purchase cost, processing cost and other costs. When inventory is delivered from warehouse, valuation should be conducted based on moving weighted average method.

3. Inventory System

The perpetual inventory system should be adopted.

4. Basis for Determination of Net Realizable Value of Inventory Method for Calculation & Drawing of Inventory Falling Price Reserves

The foundation determines value of inventory at the end of cash accounting period based on the lower one between the net realizable value and book value. When the net realizable value is less than the book value, inventory falling price reserves should be drawn based on such a difference. If the net realizable value rebounds, such rebounded amount should be reversed in the recognized amount of loss from falling price.

(IX) Short-term Investments

Short-term investments refer to those investments that can be liquidated at any time and held for no more than one year (including one year)

1. When being obtained, short-term investments should be measured based on cost of investments. Cost of short-term investments should be determined with the following method:

(1) As for short-term investment purchaser with cash, the entire costs actually paid by the foundation should be recognized as cost of investment, including tax and relevant dues such as handling charge. Cash dividends announced but not collected or bond interests due but not collected in the actually paid amount should be independently calculated as receivables and cannot constitute cost of short-term investment.

(2) As for short-term investment received through donation, its initial investment cost should be determined based on the method for recognition of donated assets.

2. When actually received, interests or cash dividends from short-term investments should be used to write down the book value of such investments, excluding those cash dividends or interests recorded in receivables at the time of purchase of such short-term investments.

3. At the end of each accounting period, the foundation should conduct an inspection on whether the decrease in value of short-term investments will

occur according to stipulations. If the market price of a short-term investment is less than its book value, falling price reserves for short-term investment should be calculated and drawn based on the difference between its market price and book value, loss from falling price of short-term investment should be recognized and recorded in current expense. If the market price of a short-term investment is greater than its book value, then the amount of such differences should be reversed within the amount of falling price reserves calculated and drawn at the beginning of the accounting period and used to set off current expenses.

4. When a short-term investment is being disposed, the current investment should be recognized based on the differences between the actually paid price and the book value of the short-term investment.

(X) Long-term Equity Investments

1. When long-term equity investments are being obtained, the actual costs of such investments should be deemed as the initial investment costs. The initial investment costs should be determined based on the following method:

(1) As for long-term equity investment purchased with cash, the entire costs actually paid by the foundation should be recognized as cost of investment, including tax and relevant expenses such as handling charge. Cash dividends announced but not collected in the actually paid amount should be independently calculated as receivables and cannot constitute the initial investment cost.

(2) As for long-term equity investment received through donation, its initial investment cost should be determined with the method for recognition of donated assets.

2. Long-term equity investments should be calculated with cost method or equity method in different circumstances. If the foundation cannot control or jointly control the invested unit and has no significant influence on the invested unit, such long-term equity investments should be calculated for accounting with cost method. If the foundation can control, jointly control or has influence on the invested unit, such long-term equity investments should be calculated for accounting with equity method.

When cost method is adapted for accounting, profits or cash dividends announced by the invested unit with the approval of its general meeting of shareholders or similar organ of authority should be deemed as current investment income.

When equity method is adopted for accounting, book value of investments should be adjusted based on the shared amount of net profit or net loss of the invested unit in the current year and such amount of adjustment should be accounted as current profit or loss in investment. The book value of investments should be written down based on the amount calculated and received by the foundation according to the amount of distributed profit or cash dividends announced by the invested.

3. When long-term equity investments are being disposed, the difference between the actually received price and book value of such investments should be recognized as current profit or loss in investments.

4. At the end of each accounting period, the foundation should conduct an inspection on whether decrease in value of long-term investments occurs. If the recoverable amount of a long-term investment is less than its book value, depreciation reserves for long-term investment should be calculated and drawn based on the difference between its recoverable amount and book value and loss from long-term investment depreciation should be recognized and recorded into current expense. If the recoverable amount of a long term investment is greater than its book value, then the amount of each difference should be reversed within the amount of depreciation reserves calculated and drawn at the beginning of the accounting period and used to set off current expenses.

(XI) Fixed Assets

1. Conditions for recognition of fixed Assets

Fixed assets refer to tangible assets with the following characteristics:

(1) Such tangible assets are held for the purposes of administration, supply of service, production or leasing.

(2) Expected service life is longer than one year.

2. Initial Measurement of Fixed Assets

Initial measurement of fixed assets should be conducted based on costs when obtained. fixed assets should be recorded for bookkeeping based on their actual costs incurred. The actual costs incurred when fixed asset is obtained incurred purchase price, racking expense, transportation expense relevant taxes and other relevant expenses as well as necessary expenditures incurred before fixed assets are available for intended use.

(1) As for purchased fixed assets, their costs should be determined based on the actual purchase price, relevant taxes and dues as well as other necessary expenditures that incurred before fixed assets are available for intended use and can be directly attributed to such fixed assets (such as transportation expense, installation expense, handling charge, etc.).

(2) As for those fixed assets built by the foundation, their costs should be determined based on all necessary expenditures incurred before such fixed assets are available for intended use.

(3) As for donated fixed assets, their costs should be determined based on the method for determining costs of donated assets.

3. Subsequent Measurement Disposal of Fixed Assets

(1) Depreciation of Fixed Assets

Except for those fully depreciated fixed assets that are still in use and land that is individually valued and recorded, depreciation of fixed assets

should be calculated and drawn based on the straight-line depreciation method according to category, and the depreciation rate should be determined based on category, expected service life and expected residual value late of fixed assets.

Deprecation of various categories of fixed assets should be calculated based on the straight-line depreciation method according to the following expected service life, expected residual value rate and depreciation rate:

(2) Subsequent Expenditures for Fixed Assets

If subsequent expenditures related to fixed assets may result in the circumstance where economic benefits are likely to flow into the foundation or service potential exceeds the previous estimation, such as prolongation of service life of fixed assets, substantial improvement of service quality or substantial reduction of cost of goods then such expenditures should be added to book value of fixed assets. However, the book value after such addition should not be greater than the recoverable amount. Other subsequent expenditures should be recorded into current expenses.

(XII) Intangible Assets

Intangible assets refer to non-physical and non-monetary long-term assets held by the foundation for the purposes of carrying out operating activities, leasing to others or implementing management, including patent right, non-patented technology, trademark right land use right, etc.

1. Initial Measurement of Intangible Assets

When being obtained, intangible assets should be calculated and recorded based on their actual costs:

(1) Actual costs of purchased intangible assets should be determined based on the actually paid price.

(2) As for these intangible assets independently developed and obtained through application based on legal procedures, the actual costs of such intangible assets should include various relevant expenses such as registration fee and attorney fee. Before obtaining such intangible assets according to law material expenses, salary and welfare expenses, rental expense, borrowing expense and other relevant expenses should be recorded into current expense.

(3) Costs of donated intangible assets should be determined based on the same method for calculating costs of donated assets.

2. Subsequent Measurement of Intangible Assets

Intangible assets should be averagely amortized and recorded into current expenses by accounting period during their expected service life since the month in which such intangible assets are obtained.

When intangible assets are being disposed, the difference between the actually received price and book value of such assets should be recorded into current revenues or expenses.

(XIII) Net Assets

1. Categorization of Net Assets

Net assets of the foundation refer to the balance calculated based on assets minus liabilities. Net assets should be categorized into limited net assets and unlimited net assets based on whether net assets are subject to limitation.

If the use of assets or economic benefits from such assets (such as income from investment, interest, etc.) are subject to time limitation or (and) use limitation as stipulated by asset provider or relevant national laws & administrative regulations, net assets formed thereof are limited net assets ;when the use of net assets is directly limited by relevant national laws administrative regulations, such net assets subject to limitation are also limited net assets; other net assets except for the above mentioned are unlimited net assets.

2. Subsequent Measurement of Net Assets

If limitation on limited net assets has been released. such limited net assets should be re categorized and converted into unlimited net assets.

In case of any of the following circumstances, limitation on limited net assets should be deemed as having been released:

(1) Time of limitation on limited net assets is due;

(2) The intended use of limited net assets has been realized (or the purpose has been achieved);

(3) Limitation on net assets has been canceled by the asset provider or relevant national laws and administrative regulations

If limited net assets are subject to two or more limitations, limitation or such net assets can only be regarded as having been released when the last limitation has been released.

(XIV) Incomes

1. Categorization of Incomes

Incomes refer to economic interests obtained from operating activities of the foundation and resulting in increase of net assets in the current period of inflow of service potential, which should be categorized into income from major operating activities including income from donation, income from membership fees, income from supply of service, income from government subsidies, income from investments as well as other incomes based on sources of income. Donated labor service accepted by the foundation shouldn't be recognized.

2. Differentiation between Income generated from Exchange transaction and Income generated from Activities Other than Exchange Transaction

(1) Income generated from sale: of goods because the exchange transaction should be recognized when the following conditions can be met;

① Major risks and remunerations concerning ownership of goods have been transferred to the purchaser;

② The foundation doesn't reserve the right of continuous management concerning ownership of sold goods or any control over such sold goods;

③ It is very likely that economic benefit related to such transaction can flow into the foundation;

④ Relevant revenue and cost can be reliably measured.

(2) Service income generated from exchange and transaction should be recognized based on the following stipulations;

① As for labor services which begin and end within one accounting year, income should be recognized when such labor services are completed;

② If a labor service begins and ends in different accounting years, income can be recognized based on schedule of completion or completed workload.

(3) Income generated from exchange and transaction and incurred because of transferring of right of assets should be recognized when the following conditions can be met;

① It is very likely that economic benefit related to such transaction can flow into the foundation;

② The amount of income can be reliably measured.

(4) Income generated from activities other than exchange transaction should be recognized when the following conditions can be met;

① Economic benefit related to such exchange of resources of service potential can flow into the foundation and will be controlled by the foundation, or relevant debts can be discharged;

② Such exchange can result in the increase of net assets;

③ Amount of income can be reliably measured.

3. Various Income Should be Calculated for Accounting Based on Whether Such Incomes Should be Divided into Unlimited Income and Limited Income

If an asset provider has set any time limitation or (and) use limitation, then recognized income should be limited income. All other income except for limited income should be recognized as unlimited income.

At the end of each accounting period, the foundation should carry limited income and unlimited income in the current period over to limited net assets and unlimited net assets under net asset respectively.

(XV). Expenses

Expenses refer to outflow of economic interests or service potential incurred for implementation of operating activities by the foundation, which results in decrease of net assets in the current period. Expenses should be categorized into costs of operating activities, administrative expense fund raising expense and other expenses.

At the end of each accounting period, the foundation should carry various expenses incurred in the current period over to unlimited net assets under net assets and record such expenses as deducted items of unlimited net assets.
